R. Civ. P. 37(d)** [#56] (collectively, the "Motions"). In light of the pending Recommendation of United States Magistrate Judge [#60] recommending that this case be dismissed,

IT IS HEREBY **ORDERED** that the Motions [#30, #31, #45, #53, #56] are **DENIED as moot**.
