ORDER OF DISMISSAL AS TO PLAINTIFF, ARIC B. FOWLER, ONLY

The matter is before me on the **Stipulation of Dismissal of Plaintiff Aric B. Fowler, Pursuant to FED. R. Civ. P.41(a)(1)(A)(ii) [#136]**¹ filed January 24, 2014. After reviewing the stipulation and the record, I conclude that the stipulation should be approved and that the claims of plaintiff, Aric B. Fowler, against the defendants should be dismissed without prejudice.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED as follows:
