The matter is before the court on **Plaintiffs' Motion To Exclude or Limit Expert Testimony Under Rule 702 and Brief in Support** [#42]<sup>2</sup> filed April 30, 2014. After reviewing the motion, the court has concluded that the motion should be stricken for failure to comply with this court's practice standard, REB Civ. Practice Standard IV.B.1.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:
