## ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR ATTORNEY FEES

**THIS MATTER** comes before the Court on Plaintiff Heath A. Warner's Motion for Attorney Fees (#24) pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act ("EAJA"), 28 U.S.C. § 2412, and the Commissioner's Response (#27).
