MINUTE ORDER¹

The matter is before the court on **Plaintiff Kirby Martensen's Motion For Leave to File Response to Defendant William Koch's Objections to Magistrate Judge Shaffer's July 29, 2014 Order Compelling Disclosure of Attorney-Client Privileged Communications and Attorney Work Product (Dkt. 198) [#211]**² filed August 25, 2014. After reviewing the motion and the record, the court has concluded that the motion should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED as follows:

1.
