**ORDER DISMISSING CLAIMS 5 AND 6 OF  
PLAINTIFF'S FIRST AMENDED COMPLAINT**

The matter is before me on the **Stipulation to Dismiss Claims 5 and 6 of Plaintiff's First Amended Complaint and Jury Demand** [#30]<sup>1</sup> filed May 5, 2014.

After reviewing the stipulation and the record, I conclude that the stipulation should be approved and that claims five and six of the **First Amended Complaint and Jury Demand** [#9] filed February 25, 2014, should be dismissed with prejudice.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:

1. That the **Stipulation to Dismiss Claims 5 and 6 of Plaintiff's First**

**Amended Complaint and Jury Demand** [#30] filed May 5, 2014, is **APPROVED**;

2. That claims five and six of the **First Amended Complaint and Jury Demand** [#9] filed February 25, 2014, are **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE** with the parties to pay their own attorney fees and costs; and

3. That by **May 16, 2014**, plaintiff shall file a status report identifying the claims that remain for determination.
