ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Blackburn, J.

The matter is before me on the **Joint Stipulated Motion to Dismiss With Prejudice** [#30]¹ filed April 28, 2014. After reviewing the motion and the record, I conclude that the motion should be granted and that this action should be dismissed with prejudice.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED as follows:

1. That the **Joint Stipulated Motion to Dismiss With Prejudice** [#30] filed April 28, 2014, is **GRANTED**;
2. That the combined Final Pretrial Conference and Trial Preparation Conference set December 19, 2014, are **VACATED**;
3. That the jury trial set to commence January 5, 2015, is **VACATED**; and

4. That this action is **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE** with the parties to pay their own attorney fees and costs.
