MINUTE ORDER

ORDER ENTERED BY MAGISTRATE JUDGE KATHLEEN M. TAFOYA

“Defendants’ Motion for Entry of Protective Order” (Doc. No. 26, filed May 14, 2014) is GRANTED in part and DENIED in part. As a final matter, any discovery provided in this litigation is to be used for purposes of this litigation only. Use of discovery documents for purposes outside the litigation is not allowed and will not be condoned by the court.
