**ORDER OF DISMISSAL OF DEFENDANTS, U.S. REPEATING ARMS COMPANY

The following matters are before the court for consideration: (1) **Notice of Voluntary Dismissal Pursuant to F.R.C.P. 41(a)(1)(A)(i)** [#10]<sup>1</sup>, regarding defendant, U.S. Repeating Arms Company; and (2) **Notice of Voluntary Dismissal Pursuant to F.R.C.P. 41(a)(1)(A)(i)** [#11], regarding defendant Browning Arms Company, both filed June 23, 2014. After reviewing the notices and the record, I conclude that the notices should be approved and that plaintiff's claims against defendants, Browning Arms Company and U.S. Repeating Arms Company, should be dismissed without prejudice.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:

1. That the **Notice of Voluntary Dismissal Pursuant to F.R.C.P. 41(a)(1)(A)(i)** [#10], regarding defendant, U.S. Repeating Arms Company, filed June 23, 2014, is

**APPROVED;**

2. That the **Notice of Voluntary Dismissal Pursuant to F.R.C.P. 41(a)(1)(A)(i)** [#11], regarding defendant, Browning Arms Company, filed June 23, 2014, is

**APPROVED;**

3. That plaintiff's claims against defendants, Browning Arms Company and U.S. Repeating Arms Company, are **DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE;** and

4. That defendants, Browning Arms Company and U.S. Repeating Arms Company, are **DROPPED** as named parties to this litigation, and the case caption is amended accordingly.
