ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The matter is before me on the **Joint Stipulation for Dismissal** [#32]¹ filed April 29, 2015. After careful review of the stipulation and the file, I conclude that the stipulation should be approved and that this action should be dismissed with prejudice.

1. That the **Joint Stipulation for Dismissal** is approved;
2. That the combined Final Pretrial Conference/Trial Preparation Conference set May 29, 2015, is vacated;

4. That the motion for leave to file out-of time motion [#25] is denied as moot; and
5. That this action is dismissed with prejudice with the parties to pay their own attorney fees and costs.
