The matters before the court are: (1) the **Motion for Leave To Serve Limited Discovery and Request for Scheduling Conference** [#13]<sup>2</sup> filed April 2, 2014; and (2) the **Motion To expedite Consideration of Elmer Eduardo Campos-Álvarez's Application for Discovery Pursuant To 28 U.S.C. § 1782** [#21] filed November 26, 2014.
