
THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED as follows:

2. That the **Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment** [#20] filed November 17, 2014, is **DENIED AS MOOT**; and
3. That this action is **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE** with the parties to pay their own attorney fees and costs.
