IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that counsel/pro se parties in this case shall hold a prescheduling conference meeting and prepare a proposed Scheduling Order in accordance with Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(f) and D.C.COLO.LCivR 16.1 and 26.1(a) on or before **twenty-one days prior** to the Scheduling Conference. Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(d) no discovery shall be sought until after the pre-scheduling conference meeting.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the parties shall comply with the mandatory disclosure requirements of Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(1) on or before **fourteen days** after the pre-scheduling conference meeting.
