## ORDER GRANTING STIPULATED MOTION FOR ATTORNEY FEES UNDER THE EQUAL ACCESS TO JUSTICE ACT

The matter before me is the parties' **Joint Stipulation for EAJA Fees and Expenses** [#27], filed April 29, 2016. As indicated by the title of the document, the parties have reached an agreement as to the amount of attorney fees to be awarded to plaintiff under the EAJA. Astrue**, 510 F.3d 1246, 1249-55 (10th Cir. 2007), **cert. denied**, 129 S.Ct. 486 (2008).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> In *Manning*, the Tenth Circuit held the plain language, structure, and history of the EAJA preclude an award of fees to anyone other than the prevailing party. Thus, even if plaintiff has assigned his right to EAJA fees to his attorney, I cannot direct the fee award be paid directly to anyone other than plaintiff himself.

- 1. That the parties' **Joint Stipulation for EAJA Fees and Expenses** [#27], filed April 29, 2016, is granted; and
- 2. That pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d)(1)(A), plaintiff is awarded attorney fees of \$6,650.00 .
