The matter is before the court on **Plaintiff's Unopposed Motion To Dismiss Without Prejudice Defendant Correctional Healthcare Companies, Only** [#10]<sup>1</sup> filed January 12, 2015. After reviewing the motion and the record, I conclude that the motion should be granted.
