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31.27 EFFECTIVE DATE--This wage order becomes effective October 31, 1981.

BY ORDER OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA WAGE-HOUR BOARD

PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION—Any person who willfully violates any provision of this wage order shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not more than \$10,000 or to imprisonment of not more than six months, or both. (See section 14 of the District of Columbia Minimum Wage Act of 1918, as amended.)

EMPLOYEE REMEDIES—(1) The employer is liable to the employee in the amount of any unpaid wages plus an equal amount as liquidated damages. (2) The Office of Wage-Hour may take an assignment in trust of a wage claim for an employee and bring any legal action necessary to collect such claim. (3) The Office of Wage-Hour may supervise the payment of unpaid wages owing employees. (See section 15 of the District of Columbia Minimum Wage Act of 1918, as amended.)
