DECLARATION OF JOHN W. KORNMEIER

I, John W. Kommeier declare the following to be a true and correct statement of facts:

- 1) I am an attorney advisor with the Executive Office for United States Attorneys ("EOUSA"), United States Department of Justice. In that capacity, my responsibilities include: acting as liaison with other divisions and offices of the Department of Justice ("DOJ") in responding to requests and the litigation filed under both the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. §552 (1988), and the Privacy Act of 1974, 5 U.S.C. §552a (1988) ("PA"); the review of FOIA/PA requests for access to records located in this office and 94 United States Attorney's offices ("USAO's") and the case files arising therefrom; the review of correspondence related to requests; the review of searches conducted in response to requests; the location of responsive records; and preparation of responses thereto by the EOUSA to assure that determinations to withhold (or to release) such responsive records are in accordance with the provisions of both the FOIA and the PA, as well as the Department of Justice regulations (28 C.F.R. §§16.3 et. seq. and §16.40 et. seq.).
- 2) As an attorney advisor of the FOIA/PA Unit, EOUSA, I have authority to release and/or withhold records requested under the FOIA/PA, and to advocate the position of the EOUSA in actions brought under these Acts. The statements I make hereinafter are made on the basis of my review of the official files and records of EOUSA, on my own personal knowledge, or on the basis of information acquired by me through the performance of my official duties.
- 3) Due to the nature of my official duties, I am familiar with the procedures followed by this office in responding to the FOIA/PA request(s) made to EOUSA by the above-captioned Plaintiff, Dulcidio Quirindongo,

(hereinafter referred to as "Mr. Quirindongo"). I have reviewed the complaint which Mr. Quirindongo has filed. Specifically I have reviewed Count IV which concerns EOUSA. This Declaration addresses Mr. Quirindongo's desire "to obtain expeditious processing of the requested records compiled in the Eastern and Middle districts of the EOUSA in Pennsylvania" (see Count IV, paragraph 12).

- 4) By letter dated September 19, 2003, Mr. Quirindongo requested a copy of all his records in the United States Attorney's Offices in the District of Puerto Rico and all the districts of Pennsylvania; Exhibit A.
- 5) EOUSA assigned four file numbers to his request: one for the District of Puerto Rico and one for each of the three districts of Pennsylvania. For the two districts for which he requests expeditious processing, EOUSA assigned the following numbers: the Middle District of Pennsylvania: 03-3176; the Eastern District of Pennsylvania: 03-3174.
- 6) By letter dated November 25, 2003, EOUSA responded to request number 03-3176 informing Mr. Quirindongo that a search for records in the Middle District of Pennsylvania had revealed no records; Exhibit B.
- 7) By letter dated March 22, 2004, EOUSA responded to request number 03-3174 for records from the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. EOUSA released records to Mr. Quirindongo and stated the reasons for any withheld; Exhibit C.
