#### DECLARATION OF KATHY HSU

- I, Kathy Hsu, declare the following to be true and correct:
- 1. I am an attorney in the Criminal Division of the United States Department of Justice assigned to the Office of Enforcement Operations. My specific assignment at the present time is that of Litigation Attorney for the Division's Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act Unit (FOIA/PA Unit).
- 2. In such capacity, my duties are, inter alia, to review complaints in lawsuits filed under both the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552 et seq., and the Privacy Act (PA), 5 U.S.C. § 552a et seq., and to provide litigation support and assistance to Assistant United States Attorneys and to Department trial attorneys litigating these cases in District Court. In conjunction with these duties, I review processing files that have been compiled by the

paralegal processors and reviewed by supervisory paralegals and/or by the FOIA/PA Unit Chief in responding to FOIA/PA requests received by the Unit. I also consult with the Unit Chief, who supervises the Unit's processing of FOIA and PA requests, and with the supervisory paralegals to confirm that determinations to withhold or to release records of the Criminal Division have been made in accordance with the provisions of both the FOIA and the PA, and with Department of Justice regulations - 28 C.F.R. 16.1 et seq.

3. I make this declaration on the basis of information acquired through the performance of my official duties.

#### Summary of Relevant Correspondence

- 4. By letter addressed to the FOIA/PA Unit, dated October 21, 2003, the plaintiff made a request for records concerning himself. See Exhibit 1.
- 5. The plaintiff's request was initially routed to the U.S. Department of Justice, Justice Management Division. The request was not forwarded to the Criminal Division's FOIA/PA Unit until on or about February 23, 2004. See Exhibit 2.
- 6. By letter addressed to the plaintiff dated March 11, 2004, the FOIA/PA Unit acknowledged receipt of Plaintiff's PA request and notified him the case had been assigned case number CRM-200400372P. The plaintiff was also advised that the FOIA/PA Unit was unable to search for the records requested because the plaintiff had not furnished a Privacy Act Identification and Request Form, and he did not indicate

on the Criminal Division's List of Systems of Records Form which systems of records maintained by the Criminal Division he wanted searched. The March 11, 2004 letter went on to state that his initial October 21, 2003 request (CRM-200400372P) would be closed, but when the appropriate forms were completed and returned, a new case number would be assigned and the request processed. The two above-mentioned forms were enclosed with the March 11, 2004 acknowledgment letter. See Exhibit 3.

- 7. On or about March 24, 2004, the plaintiff returned the Privacy Act Identification and Request Form and the Criminal Division's List of Systems of Records Form on which he had indicated which systems maintained by the Criminal Division he wanted searched. See Exhibit 4.
- 8. By letter dated May 22, 2004 addressed to the plaintiff, the FOIA/PA Unit acknowledged receipt of the plaintiff's PA request dated March 24, 2004, and assigned it case number CRM-200400628P. The plaintiff was also advised that the FOIA/PA Unit would conduct a search to determine what records the Criminal Division had within the scope of the request and that this search would encompass only Criminal Division records and that he would be notified of the result of the search once it was completed. <sup>1</sup> See

For clarification, the FOIA/PA Unit's May 22, 2004 letter addressed to the plaintiff, stated that the plaintiff's PA request (CRM-200400628P) was dated March 31, 2004. The request was received by the Criminal Division on March 31, 2004, but was actually dated March 24, 2004. See Exhibits 4 and 5.

9. By a letter dated July 27, 2004, the FOIA/PA Unit advised the plaintiff that the search he had requested of Criminal Division files had been completed and no records responsive to his request were located. The letter also informed Plaintiff that he had a right to pursue an administrative appeal and informed him of the procedures to follow should he elect to do so. See Exhibit 6.

#### Searches for Responsive Records

- 10. The Criminal Division maintains a centralized records index, JUSTICE/CRM-001, Central Criminal Division Index File and Associated Records. This system was originally intended to operate as a comprehensive catalogue of all Criminal Division law enforcement files, similar to the FBI's Central Records System (see 28 C.F.R. § 16.96). Consequently, the FOIA/PA Unit conducts, when feasible, a search of the JUSTICE/CRM-001 system in response to requests.
- 11. Because, over the years, a number of components have established their own, individualized records retrieval systems, a search sheet with a copy of the requester's Privacy Act Identification and Request Form is transmitted to all sections that may have records responsive to the requester's request. A search sheet with a copy of requester's request is also sent to all the components which the requester checks on the Criminal Division's List of Systems Form.

As stated above, Plaintiff was sent a copy of the Criminal Division's List of Systems of Records Form. See Exhibit 3. The FOIA/PA Unit sent a search sheet to all components responsible for the systems of records Plaintiff checked on his System of Records Form. See Paragraph 12 below. Designated personnel employed by the pertinent sections undertake a search for responsive materials and report the results by means of individual, signed forms to the Criminal Division FOIA/PA Unit. Searches are to be undertaken in the same manner as if the Criminal Division were seeking the information for its own, official purposes. By this means, the Criminal Division aims to ensure that its searches fully meet the criteria established under the Freedom of Information Act and the Privacy Act and interpretative decisional law.

12. In this case the FOIA/PA Unit's search for records pertaining to Plaintiff in the CRM-001 Central Criminal Division System of Records produced no responsive records. The Criminal Division FOIA/PA Unit also relies on its many years of experience in searching for records responsive to FOIA and PA requests. Based on that expertise, and the List of Systems Form returned by Plaintiff, the FOIA/PA Unit also requested that the Narcotic and Dangerous Drug Section, Computer Crime and Intellectual Property Section, Organized Crime and Racketeering Section, Witness Immunity Unit, Policy and Statutory Enforcement Unit (for records that might be contained in the system titled "General Litigation"

and Legal Advice Section"), Tax Disclosure Index, and the Office of Enforcement Operations Title III Unit conduct a search for any records responsive to Plaintiff's request. As mentioned above, to assist in properly directing their search the FOIA/PA Unit attached a copy of the plaintiff's request to the search sheets sent to all of the aforementioned sections/units. All of the aforementioned sections/units advised that they did not locate any records responsive to the plaintiff's request.

- 13. I have personally reviewed all of the original, signed search responses in this case, and have verified that no records responsive to Plaintiff's request were located.
- 14. Finally, I would note that this response is entirely consistent with my experiences as an attorney in the Criminal Division FOIA/PA Unit. There is a common misperception that the Criminal Division maintains records on all prosecutions conducted by the United States. In general, however, the Criminal Division maintains records only pertaining to those cases it actually prosecutes, which represent a small proportion of the total number of federal, criminal prosecutions. The great majority of cases are prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Offices, whose records are processed under FOIA by the Executive Office for United States Attorneys, not the Criminal Division.

15.According to plaintiff's own information, he was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. See Exhibit 4. In light

of this, it would have been surprising if responsive records had been located in Criminal Division files.
