Plaintiff is a District of Columbia resident suing the Social Security Administration. In

the one-page complaint, plaintiff alleges that while waiting in line to see a case worker, "a man

hit me in the right shoulder. I fell to my left and man court [sic] me before I hit the wall and

floor." She seeks \$500,000 in monetary damages.

The alleged facts provide no basis for recovery against the named defendant-agency.

Regardless, the Court cannot exercise jurisdiction over any damages claim against a United

States agency prior to the plaintiff's exhaustion of administrative remedies under the Federal

Tort Claims Act (FTCA), which is not apparent from the instant complaint. See 28 U.S.C.

§ 2675 (exhaustion procedures); Abdurrahman v. Engstrom, 168 Fed.Appx. 445, 445 (D.C. Cir.

2005) (per curiam) (affirming the district court's dismissal of unexhausted FTCA claim "for lack

of subject matter jurisdiction"); accord Simpkins v. District of Columbia Gov't, 108 F.3d 366,

371 (D.C. Cir. 2007). Hence, this case will be dismissed. A separate Order accompanies this

Memorandum Opinion.
