Stated briefly, the complaint is unintelligible. The Court neither can determine the identities of the defendants, nor identify the wrongs the defendants allegedly have committed. As drafted, the complaint utterly fails to set forth a short and plain statement of plaintiff's claims, and it therefore will be dismissed. See, e.g., Cofield v. Williams, No. 96-5072, 1997 WL 68271, at \*1 (D.D. Cir. Jan. 15, 1997) (affirming dismissal of "[a]ppellant's complaint and various pleadings [which] fail to provide sufficient information for appellees or the court to discern what appellees allegedly did wrong"). An Order consistent with this Memorandum Opinion is issued separately.
