

Petitioner's recourse lies, if at all, via a petition for a writ of habeas under 28 U.S.C. § 2241, which must be brought in the judicial district capable of exercising jurisdiction over his warden in North Carolina. *See Stokes v. U.S. Parole Comm'n*, 374 F.3d 1235, 1239 (D.C. Cir. 2004) (“[A] district court may not entertain a habeas petition involving present physical custody unless the respondent custodian is within its territorial jurisdiction.”). A separate order of dismissal accompanies this Memorandum Opinion.
