## **ORDER**

Currently before the court is plaintiff's Consented Motion for Leave to File an Amended Complaint. - (3) Plaintiff is directed to **FILE** her **First Amended Complaint** upon

receipt of this order; and

(4) Promptly following the filing of plaintiff's amended complaint, defendant is directed to **FILE** its **Answer** in this matter.
