## STANDING ORDER

- A party who electronically files a document exceeding twenty-five (25) pages 1. (including exhibits) in length must provide a courtesy copy of the document (including exhibits) in paper format to the assigned judge's chambers.
- In order to implement this requirement, the Clerk of the Court is directed to file 2. this Standing Order in every new civil case filed in the Fort Myers Division until further Order.
- This Standing Order is not applicable to criminal cases. 3.
