## OPINION AND ORDER<sup>1</sup>

Before the Court is pro se Plaintiff's letter advising the Court that he wishes "to drop my Civil Rights Complaint against FNU Kubik due to lack of legal knowledge." (Doc. 71 at 1). Plaintiff, who is incarcerated and has pending an Amended Civil Rights Complaint alleging deliberate indifference to dental care (see Doc. 41), apparently seeks to voluntarily dismiss this action.

Prior to an answer or motion for summary judgment by the opposing party or upon stipulation, a party may voluntarily dismiss an action without a court order. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A). Otherwise, an action may be dismissed upon the plaintiff's request by court order. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(2). Because Defendant Kubik has filed an Answer (Doc. 66), the Court construes the letter as a motion brought pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P.

41(a)(2). On August 9, 2019, Defendant Kubik filed a Notice Regarding Motion for

Summary Judgment Deadline and Plaintiff's Voluntary Dismissal. (Doc. 72). Defendant

Kubik advises the Court that due to Plaintiff's notice of voluntary dismissal he will not be

filing a motion for summary judgment by the August 15, 2019 deadline. (Doc. 72 at 2, ¶

8). Consequently, it appears that Defendant Kubik has no opposition to the Court granting

Plaintiff's motion to voluntarily dismiss this action.

Accordingly, it is now

**ORDERED:** 

Plaintiff's letter (Doc.71) construed as a motion pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(2)

is **GRANTED** and the Clerk shall enter judgment dismissing this case without prejudice,

terminate any pending motions and deadlines, and close this case.
