I have to acknowledge the honour of your letter of the 10<sup>th</sup> instant: and to express to you the very great satisfaction which I feel in the termination of your affair in a manner so agreeable to your wishes.

With respect to the Memorial which you do me the honour to enclose to me, I have only to say, That nothing but the very peculiar and affecting circumstances which marked your case, would have induced me to take upon myself to interfere in a business, with which (as my friend Mr Ferris no doubt cooperated to you) I had officially no concern whatever. I am most happy to have contributed in any degree to the attainment of the redress which I thought due to you. But I must beg leave to decline undertaking the further solicitation which you propose to me; which is equally out of the line of my official duty; but of which I have no scruple in confessing to you, I do not think the grounds equally strong with those upon which your particular application rested.
