Petition of Emanuel de la Torre

To the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury
The humble Petition of Emanuel de la Torre of Trinity Square in the County of Middlesex Merchant

Sheweth
That in the Year 1804 Don Josef de Yorba Fiscal of the Royal Audencia of Lima having been promoted by His Catholic Majesty to the Dignity of Fiscal in the Council of the Indies at Madrid was obliged to return to Spain, in the purpose of accepting his new Appointment and accordingly shipped his own private property together with a considerable Sum of Money belonging to the Estate of the Marquis de Somo a Spanish Nobleman to whom Don Josef was Executor

That the particulars of the property so shipped the Names of the Vessels in which it was shipped and the Names of the Vessels by which it was Captured and the respective times of Capture are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written

That the said Property was not only embarked before the Commencement of Hostilities between England and Spain but that the greatest part thereof was detained by His Britannic Majesty's Ships prior to that Event as will appear by reference to the said Schedule

That the said Don Josef de Yorba having finally arranged his Affairs in America departed for Europe and after experiencing a great delay distress and Inconvenience arrived in Spain with his Family and Household but in Consequence of the unexpected loss of his whole property as before mentioned has been reduced from a State of Affluence to the most deplorable Indigence a Situation the more distressing in Consequence of his Rank and former Splendor of having also

the restoration of the said Property or such

seem meet


