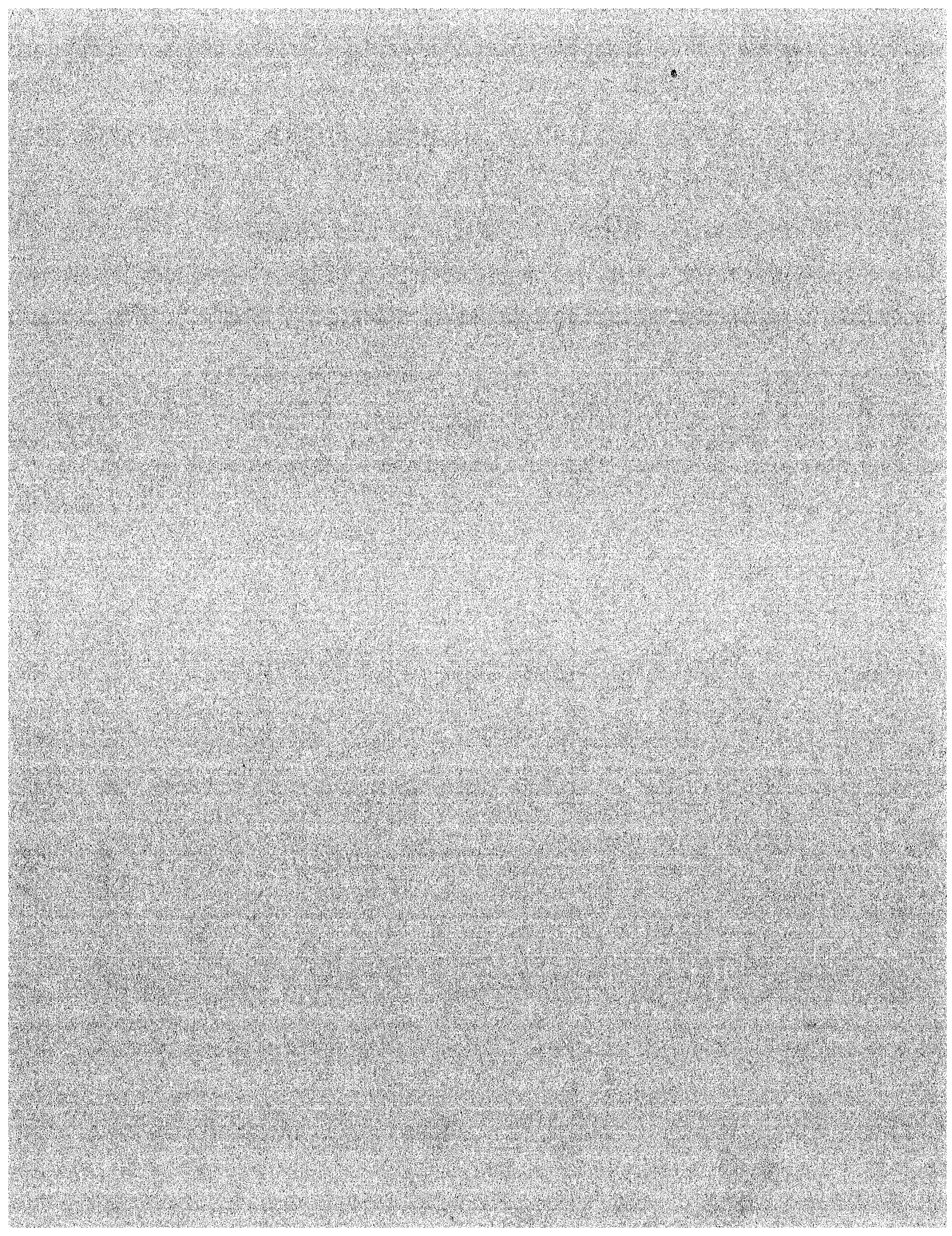

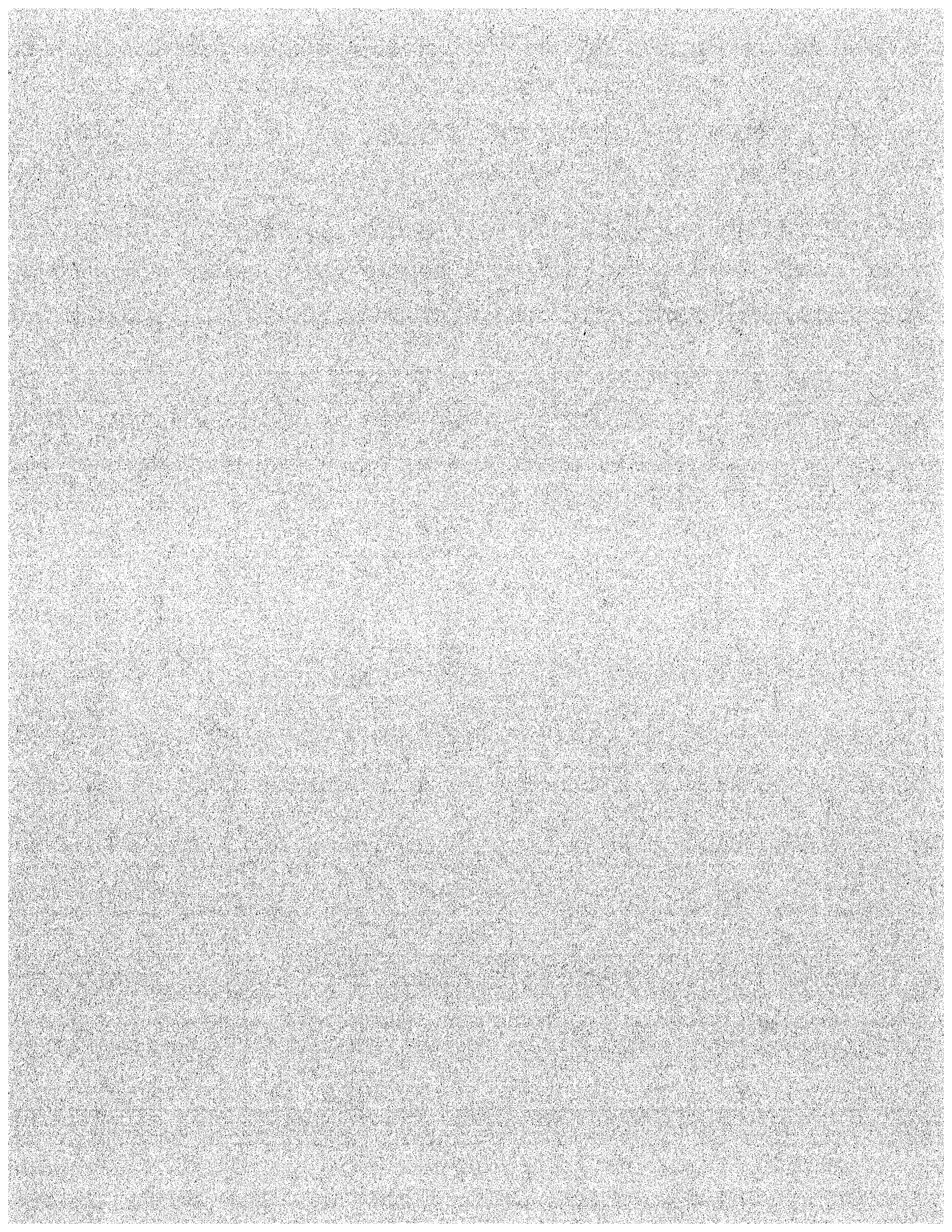

Note

The cargo taken from Callao de Lima by the War Frigate Asuncion was transferred to the Medea, a ship of the same class, in Montevideo, as it was impossible for the Asuncion to continue on to Spain. The registry that the Medea took of this event in Montevideo cannot be correlated given that neither the registry, which should have been remitted by the Customs Officer, nor any other information whatsoever, has been received.





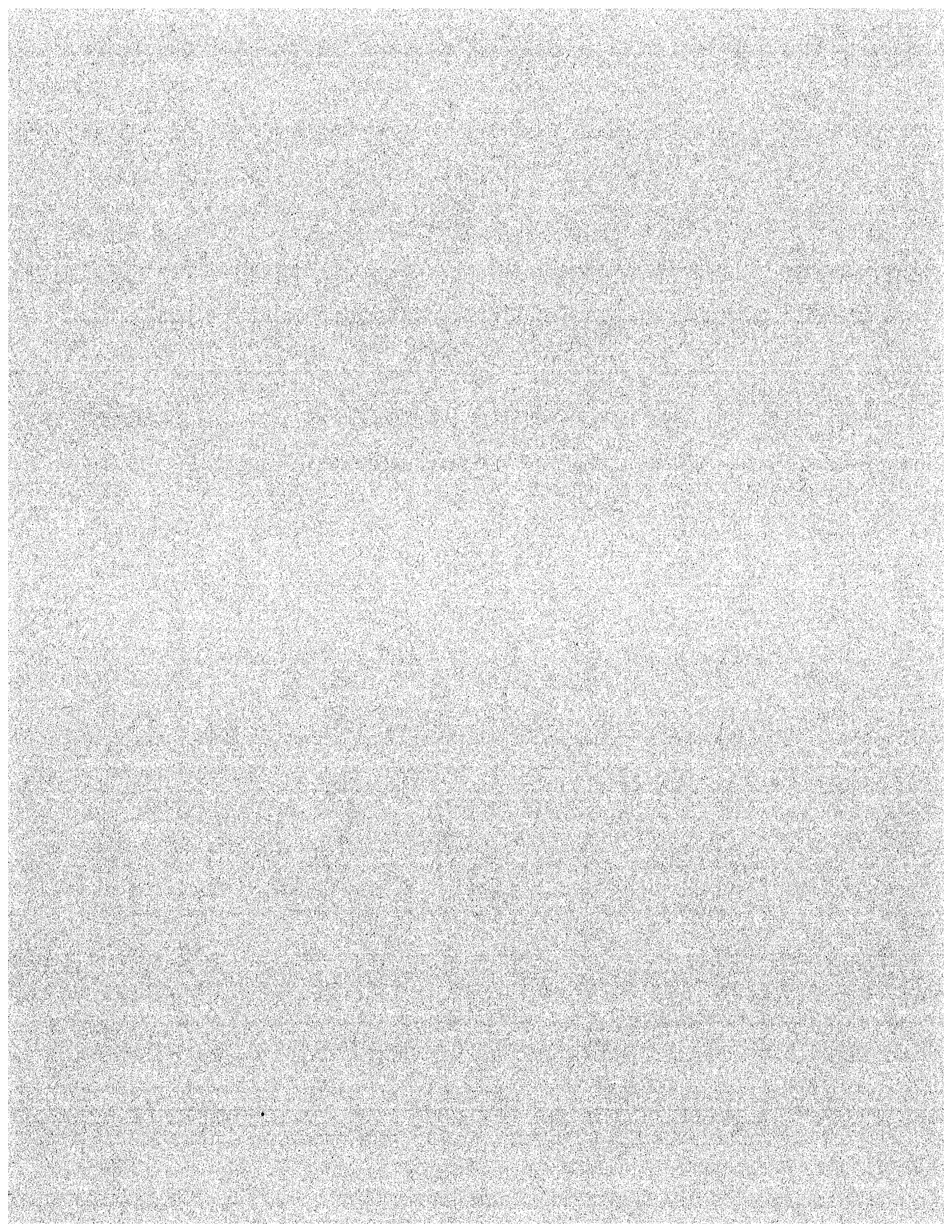


