ORDER

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED:

Plaintiff may file an amended complaint by May 23, 2011. Failure to do so will result in the Court dismissing the case without prejudice for lack of subject matter jurisdiction.

See Beavers v. A.O. Smith Elec. Products Co., 265 Fed. App'x 772, 779 (11th Cir. 2008) (When a court discovers that it lacks jurisdiction, the court must dismiss the action pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(h)(3)).
