ORDER

GRANTED.

(3) The final decision of the Commissioner is **REVERSED**. This case is

REMANDED to the Commissioner pursuant to sentence four of 42 U.S.C. § 405(g)

for further proceedings.

(4) The Clerk is directed to terminate any pending motions, enter a judgment in favor

of Plaintiff, and close this case.
