PLAINTIFF'S NOTICE TO THE COURT

COMES NOW plaintiff, John B. Thompson, hereinafter Thompson, as an attorney on his own behalf, and hereby provides notice to the court, as follows:

The court has expressed its concern in its show cause order of September 24, 2007, that "children" not be exposed to "obscenity."

Great. Plaintiff hereby provides notice to the court that he is available all day every day, until November 26, 2007, to proceed to the federal courthouse and provide testimony to the court to enable it to ascertain whether allegations about Mr. Kent's "obscenity" trafficking "are true or not," as the court in its latest order of October 22 indicated.

If this court is *really* concerned about "children," then it has no choice, with all respect, but to ascertain the truth or falsity of what Thompson has alleged. This court's order of October 22 questions, it appears, Thompson's veracity on this, which is remarkable in that whether what Thompson has alleged is "true or not" can be corroborated by third party sources.

If the court fails to bring Thompson to court to prove what he knows to be true and can corroborate, then the court is left with its uninformed, discriminatory bias against Thompson's faith-based activism, so thoroughly evident in The Florida Bar's actions.
