MR. HASTY: Okay. We are here November 24th to conduct the inspection of documents in the matter of Howard Adelman and Judith Sclawy, as co-personal representatives of the estate of Michael Sclawy Adelman, case number 10-CV-22236-ASG. And present as defense counsel are?

MR. SUMMERS: Bill Summers on behalf of the Boy Scouts.

MR. WINSBY: Joseph Winsby on behalf of the Plantation United Methodist Church.

MR. HASTY: And my name is Frederick Hasty on behalf of Howard Crompton and Andrew Schmidt, the defendants.

So, we're going to look at the production of documents pursuant to Federal Rule 26 from the plaintiffs, and we're going to identify what is here as best we can. If we have questions, we will then pose them to the plaintiff's counsel, who are not present in the room, but have a representative law clerk present.

MR. SUMMERS: I'll start with, there are boxes one through five the way they are labeled and there seems to be about five of the large boxes that contains the backpack, a Camel backpack.

Looking in the compartments, starting with the back going forward, the first compartment has a towel and
it has a Quaker chewy.
MR. HASTY: Get the flavor there, because there are several.

MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Honey nut. Then in the main compartment, I pulled out a Camel back water pack, which is used as a hose to drink from, I don't see the size on it.

MR. HASTY: It doesn't matter.
MR. SUMMERS: It's at least a quart, it's pretty standard issue backpack. There is an orange pouch, let's see what's in it, inside the pouch are a pair of socks that haven't been used.

MR. HASTY: Boy Scout socks.
MR. SUMMERS: Boy Scout socks. There is what looks like a bandage, a towelette, it's in a plastic bag, it's toilet paper, about a one-inch roll. Then there is a Trek One first aid kit, brand name Coghlan's. Do you want to list the contents?

MR. HASTY: Yes.
MR. SUMMERS: Okay. It looks like a pretty standard hiking -- it has three dry wipes, which look like they are probably dried out, but not open. It's got six large Band-Aids, it has five -- six large Band-Aids, two small Band-Aids and I guess these are the things put on your nose to breathe that you see the football players
with them. It has something about a one-by-two inch strip that I probably would call mole skin, also used for hiking. There is a piece from the back of a Band-Aid, which shows that there must have been a Band-Aid used at some point, do you see this?

MR. HASTY: Yes.
MR. SUMMERS: I'm showing that. We have a roll of tape, $I$ can't tell if it is gauze, but it is probably adhesive tape. There is an Instant Guide to First Aid here, I'll come back to that. There is also several additional items of mole skin, it looks like they are three-by-four inches, there are three of those, and there is a partial piece which is about two inches by two inches, it has been cut from a larger piece at one time. There is a larger Band-Aid. There is a gauze pad, a three-by-three gauze pad, it looks like there are four of those.

The Instant Guide to First Aid has a needle in it it pulls out. You might want to get a copy of this, Rick? The thing is covered here, it covers quite a bit, including heat exhaustion, heart attack and heat stroke.

MR. HASTY: Just read what --
MR. SUMMERS: "Heat exhaustion," I'm going to go with heart attack, too. "Heart attack, pain in the chest, three columns, "Injury, symptoms and treatment,
heart attack, pain in the chest, shoulders, lower jaw, upper arm, complaints of heartburn or indigestion, blue/gray pallor, sweating, apprehension, distress, denial. The treatment is arrange for transportation or seek medical assistance -- sit in a position of comfort, usually semi-sitting, monitor vital signs, be prepared to assist with CPR."

Next with, "Heat exhaustion, cool, clammy skin, weak, rapid pulse, rapid, shallow breathing. The treatment, move to a cooler area if possible, remove extra clothing, treat for shock. Recovery should follow a short rest, otherwise seek medical care."

Heat stroke is the third item, "Rapid onset, hot, dry, flushed skin, initial, rapid pulse, decreasing progressively, twitching, convulsions. The treatment is quickly cool the person, remove clothing, fan, wrap in a sheet and sprinkle with water, stabilize and monitor vitals, transport."

I'm going to read stroke, because one of them referred to stroke. Under stroke, the second column reads, "Inability to speak, one side of the face appears flaccid or sagging, one pupil larger than the other, slow pulse, one-sided paralysis. Treatment, transport, medical aid in a position of comfort, often semi-prone or semi-sitting, monitor vitals and assist with AR or CPR,"

I think we should probably get a copy of this.
MR. HASTY: Yes. In the backpack, there was also this, put on the record, there are four peanut Nature Valley bars, two packs of Orbit gum containing 14 pieces in each which are mint, five Nature Valley oat and honey bars, a container of Neutrogena Ultra Sheer Body Mist Sunblock, SPF 70, Neutrogena Ultra Sheer Dry Touch Sunblock, lightweight, clean ointment, SPF 70, a National Parks Systems map and guide which has the Big Cypress, it's an actual map. On the back there are -- there is information about the national park system guide.

MR. SUMMERS: I'm putting everything back in the orange bag. I also note that there are some either peanuts or flakes from it looks like one of the power bars.

MR. HASTY: Did you go in this section here? MR. SUMMERS: No.

MR. HASTY: This is more tubing, another pack.
MR. SUMMERS: What we found as part of the Camel backpack, it contains it's own water bladder, so there is a water bladder inside the backpack and then there is a separate water bottle, Camel back that's actually separate from the back, it probably can be strapped on the back of the pack.

MR. HASTY: Does it say --

MR. WINSBY: This is a Camel bladder that we found within the smaller compartment of the backpack and it reads, "80 ounces."

MR. SUMMERS: That has -- you see it?
MR. HASTY: It's own bottle.
MR. SUMMERS: It's the same basic --
MR. HASTY: It says "100" here, that's 100 ounces. That takes care of that pack.

MR. SUMMERS: Did you check this side?
MR. HASTY: I did not.
MR. SUMMERS: Okay. In the side pocket on the right-hand side there is an oats honey wrapper. The other side pocket on the left-hand side is empty. There is a capital "M" written inside the back of the backpack.

MR. HASTY: In this box we have two certificates of appreciation to Howard Adelman, one is dated September 10th, 2008, one is dated September 27th, 2006. In 2006, it says, "For dedication and service for Scouts Troop 111 as a 2006 summer camp leader, Sky Mont Reservation, Altamonte, Tennessee," and that's the one dated September 27th, signed by Andy Schmidt as the scout master and Linda Vedsted as committee chair. Then the other certificate is to Howard Adelman, "In appreciation," dated September 10th, 2008 for summer camp adult leader, Camp Raven Knob, Mont Airy, North Carolina
and this is, again, signed by Andy Schmidt and Howard Crompton, committee chair. Just take a picture there.

There is also a certificate or a plaque to Howard Adelman and that is dated September 28, 2005 for being an adult leader, summer camp at Camp Sequoyah, Delta, Alabama in September 28, 2005, signed by Andy Schmidt, scout master, and Linda Vedsted, committee chair. You got that, right?

MR. SUMMERS: Yes.
MR. HASTY: There is a troop name badge.
MR. SUMMERS: For both parents.
MR. HASTY: And then from the same box are some badges.

MR. SUMMERS: These are position bangs.
MR. HASTY: Yes.
MR. SUMMERS: These are advancement badges and it looks like this is a beaver patrol badge, patrol leader badge, assistant patrol leader badge, quality unit 2000 badge, South Florida Council 2003 arm patch. This is one of the -- what is that? It's a round patch with a red arrow on it and then it has the ranks up through first class.

MR. HASTY: Take a picture of that. Then we have "The Boy Scout Handbook, A Guide to Adventure, A Guidebook for Life." This book is --

MR. SUMMERS: It looks like it's untouched. This may be a very new one.

MR. HASTY: Yes, I was looking for the date.
MR. SUMMERS: I can find that probably. It goes beyond this. The parent's guide is still in there.

MR. HASTY: It's the 12th Edition.
MR. SUMMERS: It's the 12th Edition, copyright 2009, so we're looking at something published in the year 2009 or 2010, it has a cover with an eagle and at the top there are some kids on a raft. Based on the way it looks on the edges, $I$ don't think it has ever really been opened up.

MR. HASTY: And we have the merit badge series for hiking, Boy Scouts of America. Let's see if we can find a date.

MR. SUMMERS: It might have been used, but it's not marked. It's a 2009 printing. Take a picture of that. There is a field book here, fourth edition, copyright 2004, it shows Roy Williams as the chief scout executive, it doesn't seem to have had much use. Then there are some merit badge books on emergency preparedness, camping, first aid and personal fitness.

MR. HASTY: Let's get the dates.
MR. SUMMERS: Personal fitness has no marks in it, it doesn't appear to have much, if any, use, it's the

2010 printing of the 2009 revision. The first aid merit badge is 2010 printing of the 2007 copyright. All of these appear to be very recent and unused. The camping merit badge book is the 2010 printing of the 2005 copyright. The emergency preparedness merit badge is the 2008 printing of the 2008 copyright.

MR. HASTY: Those clothes, was he wearing those clothes? Are those his clothes that he owned? MS. TIE: I am not sure.

MR. SUMMERS: None of these merit badges seem to show much, if any, use. There are actually six boxes, aren't they? One is a priority mailbox.

MS. TIE: Actually, those are separate out of those boxes.

MR. SUMMERS: Which one? The big one?
MS. TIE: The books are not in that.
MR. HASTY: They were kept separate.
MR. SUMMERS: So in the number six box, that was the certificates, the cloth patches, the name tag and the plaque.

MR. HASTY: Two certificates, one plaque. This was a separate pile.

MR. SUMMERS: So there are six boxes and three piles and three tubes.

MR. HASTY: What box number is that?

MR. WINSBY: This is box number four of five. MR. HASTY: Four of five. These appear to be clothes.

MR. SUMMERS: These are class Bs and class A uniform, one for the troop, Troop 111. Let's just see. The dark brown and black, it's a large. There is a Merit Badge College white T-shirt, large, I don't see a year on that. There is a pair of classic scout shorts.

MR. HASTY: Another troop T-shirt.
MR. SUMMERS: The same size?
MR. HASTY: It's a large.
MR. SUMMERS: Okay. We'll take a picture of that. The next T-shirt is "Opportunity is now," anything on the back of that one?

MR. HASTY: No, it's a large. Let's go off the record for a minute.
(Off the record.)
MR. SUMMERS: Another T-shirt, "The ultimate Summer Camp Experience, Survivor Camp," I don't know what that is. Where do the words start and stop? "Camp Comer Camp Sequoyah, Greater Alabama Council."

MR. HASTY: I think it's camp -- Comer Camp Sequoyah, Great Alabama Council.

MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Hold that up for us. There is a troop cap. There are some arm braids which
were probably for a troop guide. There is a Boy Scout shirt, it's a mens' large, it shows a scribe, it has a "Trained patch," which you normally see on adults, it has a Life Scout emblem on the left front pocket and it has the patch from the Scout Master's Camp 30th anniversary in 2009. Take a picture of that.

MR. HASTY: Markham Park, Sunrise, Florida and this is the scout master's camporee.

MR. SUMMERS: There is a pair of long pants, scout pants, it has a minor's name written in them, Michael's name written in there, a size 36 waist and they are rolled up at the bottom about three inches.

MR. HASTY: Shorts, socks, T-shirts.
MR. SUMMERS: There is another pair of long pants, size 38. When I say size 38 , waist 38 , a scruffy, torn up T-shirt. It looks like this was probably what he was wearing is my guess, it's been cut down the front.

MR. HASTY: That's the one he was using the day he died?

MR. SUMMERS: Yes. This says, "United States of America" on the front of it and on the patch it has the troop identified, another pair of shorts, these are size 38s, a scout belt with a buckle, another T-shirt, this one has some paint on it, it's a Troop 111 T-shirt, this one is dark green, another troop T-shirt 111 with
the label cut out, it looks like it's in pretty good shape, another pair of shorts, these are size 38s, then there are several pairs of socks. There are four of the low-rise socks and it looks like seven-and-a-half pairs of the high socks, not the very highest but the mid-socks. Continuing with box four which contains clothes.

MR. HASTY: You guys can do these.
MR. SUMMERS: Looking at the tubes --
MR. HASTY: There are three of them.
MR. WINSBY: They are differentiated from the outside.

MR. SUMMERS: I opened one, it has a red banner in it, it says, "Forever in our heart," and one of them says, "Never forgotten, RIP, Michael," signed, "Love, Molly," so this looks like this is after-the-fact. This is a banner that is 10 or 15 feet long, maybe longer, and it looks like maybe ten or so people signed it, Sharon signed it, Moki signed it, Sara signed it, Briana signed it, Laurel signed it, Chandler, Molly, Alex Abreu, Courtney C., Natasha Logan, I'll try and read this, T-A-T-I-A-N-N-A, last name, B-L-O-T, Amber, Sara Davis. The next one, you have a more challenging assignment than I have.

MR. WINSBY: I removed a large, brown paper
scroll from one of the white tubes, it contains a banner that reads in part, "RIP." The banner in its entirety reads, "From all at Nova High School, RIP, Michael Sclawy," and there are many notes, apparently from the students at Nova High School to Michael.

MR. HASTY: Why don't we start a pile then? MS. TIE: Okay.

MR. HASTY: I'm looking at a notebook that says, "The Michael Sclawy Adelman memory album," we're going to want this whole document copied. There are a lot of letters in here.

MR. SUMMERS: So you now in the three tubes, we have the one red cloth banner with a little bit written on it, we have one brown paper banner with a lot written on it and then we have the third one, which is another brown paper banner, and it has a medium amount written on it. The first paper banner was full, this one is I would say about half full. Rick, we will not finish by noon.

MR. HASTY: No, I don't think so.
MR. SUMMERS: There are three boxes that we haven't gone into.

MR. HASTY: Wait. Hold on. I'm almost done. I have been going through the memory album and there is a letter from Christine Chambers, is it Chambers or

Chombers? I think it's Chombers, C-H-O-M-B-E-R-S, and then there is a letter from his sister, Elizabeth, which are not actually in the three-ring binder, they are in the folder or the slat of the three-ring binder, so we're going to want to get those copied. I'm almost done here. I'm going to want copies of that.

MR. SUMMERS: Right.
MR. HASTY: I'm done with this. I'd like to get these today. The rest of these I could get next week and the memory album, but this I would like to get today. MR. SUMMERS: Let me take a picture of the memory album.

MR. HASTY: It didn't flash.
MR. SUMMERS: No, it did not. As far as these, we are looking at several scout publications, there is The Health and Safety Guide, it looks new, it's the 2006 printing.

MR. HASTY: The Passport to High Adventure. MR. SUMMERS: 2008, it looks unused.

MR. HASTY: Scout master, assistant scout master, leader, specific training.

MR. SUMMERS: He mentioned there is a CD ROM enclosed, this is a 2010 printing, and it doesn't look like it has been touched. There is a CD ROM in the back. MR. HASTY: Is that the whole book on the ROM?

Third edition?
MR. SUMMERS: Very likely the --
MR. HASTY: I wonder if they could run that right now, can you do that?

MS. TIE: I'm sorry?
MR. SUMMERS: There is a CD here, can you copy it?

MS. TIE: I will check with the IT people.
MR. SUMMERS: Okay. So we're talking about the scout master, assistant scout master, leader training, so we'll try to get a copy of the CD ROM in the back so we can walk out with that.

MR. HASTY: We'll just wait a minute, because if that could be done, we may not have to copy it. This has never been taken out?

MS. TIE: No.
MR. HASTY: So I'd have to break the seal, I'm going to let you do that. Here, why don't you do that? Either you could make a hard copy or if they can make a copy of the CD ROM? I'm not going to break the seal. You all decide how you want to handle it, it's your property. We'll just go off the record for a minute.
(Off the record.)
MR. SUMMERS: Okay. We'll continue.
MR. HASTY: We could use a professional copy
service if that's what you want to do?
MS. TIE: Well, I mean, I don't know what the total copying is going to be, so it would be kind of better if you guys want to put together an entire pile of things so we can decide if a professional copy service would be easier, better, if all you want is a couple of pages.

MR. HASTY: It's going to be a lot.
MR. SUMMERS: You don't want to do it in-house?

MR. HASTY: The other issue is we have a time constraint, the parents' depositions are coming up.

MS. TIE: Right.
MR. SUMMERS: The document we're looking at now is, "Troop Program Features, Volume II," it is the 2007 printing. Then there is the Scout Master Handbook, which is a white notebook, it is the 2009 printing. None of these books appear to have been used. There is "The Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills," which is the 2010 printing, with a copyright of 2000. There is "The Troop Committee Guidebook," which is the 2008 printing of the 1998 copyright, then there are quite a few internet, well, maybe not. The first item on top is an internet printout of two pages, "Sweet 16 VSA Safety," the website is scouting.org/scoutsource/heathandsafety/sweet16, and
that was dated November 24th, 2010, so I guess that was this morning. Then there is Treck Safety which has a 2003 copyright and this was copied out of a book. You can see where the staple marks are in the upper left, there are three pages, Seven Points of Treck Safety Program, then there is a guide to safe scouting.

MS. TIE: That's the whole pile?
MR. SUMMERS: Yes. It probably was printed off of the internet in color, it is a 2007 printing of the 1998 copyright and this one has a total of 68 pages, plus unnumbered pages that at the top say, "Notes," but otherwise the page is blank, there are three of those. Then there is one page, "Scouting Dollars." The next is, "Support Scouting BSA Risk Ready," and the last page is -- this contains the universal code and the Boy Scout emblem and dress, so it's a guide to safe scouting of some publication. Did we get the date on the scout master handbook? Just to make sure, it is the 2009 printing. You have this notebook in front of you, and the pages you talk about, how do you want to handle that?

MR. HASTY: I just need to get a copy.
MR. SUMMERS: The memory album?
MR. HASTY: Yes. There is a letter from Elizabeth, his sister, and another young lady, with a handwritten note, which is not a part of the three-ring
binder.
MR. SUMMERS: The one from Christine Chambers, it's a full page --

MR. HASTY: I think it's Chombers.
MR. SUMMERS: Chombers, plus five lines on the back of it, "PS," and the other one seems to be a photocopy of a three page letter. I'll take a picture of that. Those three boxes, we haven't opened any of that, they are largely filled with paper.

MR. HASTY: This one is box number, it's labeled three and five.

MR. SUMMERS: Why don't I say what they are? What you are looking at this first page, that's probably from first aid. Identifying poisonous plants, Page 318 is probably a reference to The Boy Scout Handbook, he's identifying ivy, sumak, poison oak, which is a poisonous plant and he identifies the different pages I believe from the reference to the Boy Scout Handbook, how to treat these problems.

We have printouts showing his schedule, probably at Merit Badge College, it's on Saturday morning and Saturday afternoon, so I'm 99 percent sure it's Merit Badge College.

MR. WINSBY: All these documents are coming from a red hanging folder.

MR. SUMMERS: Yes. We've got a family tree that may be from a genealogy, a merit badge, then we have some color pictures probably of their house, but it's of the foliage around it. We have a printout. We have a copy of the Family Life Requirement and then the prerequisites. There is a blank page and the different schedules. It looks like a second time he has gone to Merit Badge College, this time with nature study and genealogy, so that matches what we've just seen, it has the requirements on reading merit badge, the requirements on leather works. Rick, do you want me to record what these are or just get a copy of them?

MR. HASTY: What is the word on the CD?
MS. TIE: I got ahold of Mark and I will go ahead and make a copy of the letter from Elizabeth, that I can give to you guys today, but as far as everything else goes, if you guys want to put together a list of everything you want copied because, obviously, it is going to be a massive amount of paper and miscellaneous items, that we're going to have to use a copy service to take care of that? So if you guys just want to keep a running tab of what you want?

MR. SUMMERS: I think we're going to stack them at the end of the table.

MR. HASTY: Well, we need to identify it, make
sure we get it, that's the problem.
MR. SUMMERS: Then I'll read through it.
MR. HASTY: Yes.
MR. SUMMERS: Continuing through the red hanging folder, it's the list of things to do before Scout Masters, probably a reference to the scout master's camp out and he has service project and Riverside Regional.

MR. HASTY: She says start stacking what we want copied.

MR. SUMMERS: Do you want a copy of this?
MR. HASTY: I do.
MR. SUMMERS: Inside the red hanging folder is a blue folder with his name on the front. There is a loose sheet in here that is identifying plants, casterdine, sea grapes, "Project idea, kill as many wasps who build nests as possible at my house," otherwise the folder has about 40 pages of blank noted paper. Then there is a reservation schedule for Merit Badge College, the printout date is November 2003 and three other merit badges, plus a December 2003 note from scout master Nick Turnes, Junior of Troop 111, talking about prerequisites done for citizenship in the community. There is a white envelope that apparently one time contained firemen's chit. There is a yellow notebook pad that contains
doodling on the second page, on the first page it looks like the start of a genealogy tree.

I have a note in here on plantation utility spending, so that is going to be part of one of the citizenships, probably citizenship and community, something on basketry. Then there is a printout of a schedule, which is similar to the one we've seen before, from the ' 03 Merit Badge College, the requirements for reading merit badge, minutes from the City of Plantation council, which would be for the citizenship merit badge, basketry instructions and use, requirement one is a two page set of requirements on reading, then requirements on citizenship immunity, all this matches for the '03 Merit Badge College citizenship in the community requirements, a troop meeting schedule for 2003, 2004, which is useful, and it goes over the different merit badges they are going to be covering in their troop meeting for the new scouts and the older scouts, a crime prevention merit badge e-mail from September of 2003, a white sheet with his name and phone number on it, troop electronics and a PLC meeting set in August, it must have been a Disney camp out in June of one year and it says, "Viking opening."

There is a PLC meeting for March 10, 2004, which shows they are organizing, planning. There is
another white sheet of paper, notebook paper with blue writing on it with the schedule for the viking opening, the Dragon Patrol opening, so viking is going to be a patrol, a code of honor, a preparation for the Miami camp out, he must have been on the PLC at that time and those are his minutes from the meeting, he must have been secretary then.

There is a PLC meeting February of 2004, team volunteer program guidelines with a small, yellow insert talking about something in June of some year, a teen volunteer program guidelines front and back with West Regional Library, no date, a merit badge, a nature merit badge presented by Disney Wilderness Adventures, which seems to be associated with their Disney camp out and it's mostly filled in in pencil, it has a plant checklist, a bug checklist, a scout field trip to the post office e-mail in March of '05, lots of e-mail in here, an e-mail on a post office trip from Kathy Hahn who is probably a -- whose last name is Shookie, S-H-O-O-K-I-E, who is probably going to be a troop adult.

There is one page on the troop merit badge procedures on how to get one, and at that time, Ms. Newman was recording completed blue cards and revision dates in August of ' 05 . There is a white sheet that has kids' writing on both sides, at the top it
reads, "Environmental science, write report," so this looks like work on the environmental science merit badge. There is a notebook paper with one paragraph at the top, "Hypothetical construction project, park ride areas, environmental impact statement." Then there is a full page of notes, "Week zero, 10/26, Hurricane Wilma has passed by two days earlier," and he's talking about things it looks like the effects on the plants, "Week one, after hurricane leaves, must be monitoring some plant growth, week two, more bugs, week three, the main difference between week two and three is that the plants were greener, that's all red folders connected with merit badges.

MR. HASTY: These are loose documents.
MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Going through loose documents. At the top it reads, "Merit badge books," these are books that correspond to merit badges Mike was starting but didn't complete or completed and then there is a list of merit badge books, and then it says, "These are books that we purchased but Mike didn't use. They are older books that we had gotten for him to see if he was interested in earning the corresponding merit badges," and the merit badges listed are drafting, entrepreneurship, sports, backpacking, orienteering, music, bugling and cooking. There is a note, probably
from the parents, it says, "We also have Mike's 2008 requirements book."

It looks like the next thing is a duplicate handout for summer camp 2003. They went to Camp Woodruff, which is northeast of Atlanta, that's W-O-O-D-R-U-F-F, and they would have gone in the last week of June, the first week of July of 2003. Then there is a summer camp 2005 list with what to bring, telling to label all of their possessions which corresponds with the name that is seen in his uniforms, but he doesn't have a troop number in there. We can't tell the date of this summer camp, other than '05, then there are several copies of it.

There is a white sheet dated May of 2003 from the assistant scout master Steve Ajzel, which is signed by Michael, and it is for his merit badges that he wants to take, activities of the Stone Mountain trip, the Outpost Experience and Golden Skillet, which would be special activities at a summer camp.

There is another sheet which is a schedule, probably from summer camp, because it includes horseback riding and a one mile swim and down at the bottom it is written, "This is a typical schedule for Monday through Thursday," so these are instructions to the boys for summer camp. The Camp Woodruff merit badge report on

Michael shows he earned Indian lore, woodcarving, mammal study, rifle shooting, basketry and that was dated July of 2003. There is then a large folder that I'll take a picture of, it's a scout folder that lists the points of the scout law on the front of it, very colorful, on the inside it has two items which are handouts of May 12, 2009. This is an important handout, it looks like a May 12, 2009 note to the family giving their apologies, "Sincere and deepest sympathy" is what it says. Then there is an individual progress report printed out from the internet for Michael, dated 5/11/09, there are four pages.

The remaining requirements as of $5 / 11$ were shown as three Eagle merit barges, emergency prep or life saving, personal fitness and then swimming or cycling or hiking, plus an eagle scout project, plus a scout master conference, this is dated 5/11, the date of birth is 5/23.

There is a service project workbook that we are going to be looking at, too, it's in a white, it's roughly a one inch booklet, it has on the inside cover a pocket, it has two sheets of paper in it, one is blank, the other one is a rough drawing of a structure maybe or a panel on a structure. He has the blank notebook form that Doug Roach came up with for the hurricane districts
several years ago. He has his plan signed off as of November of 2007 for Flamingo Gardens, the contact name was Michael Ruggieri, it hasn't been authorized yet, that is the plan is not signed off yet. I'm looking for dates.

There is a development plan that is being worked on. There is a site plan that is drawn up and some other details that are drawn up, including a door, the development plan is blank, the development sign off is blank, the schedule sections are blank, the carryout sections are blank. There is a section in the back pocket that contains some additional work, it looks like someone suggested other items he needs to add to it and he's written them down, "Need to fill in the quantity of items needed," there is a note here, "Other items needed, Personal fitness, hiking and fitness, emergency prep." Under emergency prep is written off to the right-hand side, "Completing/Completed," then we have a write-up on how he's going to recruit people.

Then there is an e-mail from October 2007 from Patty Geyer copied to other people in the troop, "Mike, you are off to a really good start," and then she gives some suggestions on what he has to do to work on his write-up. There is an August of 2008 e-mail talking about some poles Mike Blew (ph) has, so this talks about
how to do the project in 2008 and then there are some drawings with that.

Next is the personal health and medical records, it's a class three form, it's dated 3/28/05, signed by a doctor on 7/28/05, it's two pages, most of the information is on the first page. Then there is a personal health and medical record form class three, that is dated 10/30/2002, signed by the doctor that date, there are two copies of this one. On the weight section there is either an asterisk or a pound sign, I guess that's a pound sign, $I$ don't see where there is an asterisk talked about anywhere else.

There is a spiral bound five-by-eight book that is boy scout requirements 2008, printing date 2008 and it doesn't seem to have been used. There is a card from the South Florida Council, I can't tell who signed it, but they are including some merit badges that Jeff Hunt asked that before we -- I believe this is in connection with the family asking for complete copies of items to make up a scout book for Michael, and I believe, make sure we see a scout book in here, because that is what this form is used for and that postage was April 21, 2010. There is a Camp Sequoyah handout for June 11, that would be a summer camp Alabama, it's a 2005 summer camp. There is a --

MS. TIE: There were three patches in here that are no longer in this envelope.

MR. HASTY: I opened it, there were no patches in there.

MR. SUMMERS: They weren't in there when we --
MR. HASTY: It came out of that box.
MR. SUMMERS: Yes, it could be loose in that box, that's why I'm saying as we go through.

MR. HASTY: I took it out of that box and there are no patches in it. There are patches around.

MS. TIE: But that envelope, I actually know for a fact --

MR. SUMMERS: If you will not talk, I can keep doing this.

MS. TIE: Those three right there.
MR. SUMMERS: So the patches that are included look to be personal fitness, hiking and emergency preparedness, and I'm going to put them in here and turn the card so it points down so they'll hopefully stay there. Then there is some paperwork from the cub scouts.

The father is given a thank you for participating in 2005 Pinewood Island District Derby, the boy is given one for participating in the 2005 District 30. There is a sheet from Camp Tanah Keeta, which is the camp up in the Palm Beach area, the date this was to be
used to go to camp I can't tell. There is another class three medical dated 6/1/06 and it's stamped by Cardiology Associates of West Broward, that's unlike the others. Going back to the others, there is a Dr. Ron, the last name starts with a B, like in Bush, who signed it and he signed the '02 one, the '05 was signed by Dr. Jeffrey Fliegenspan at Pediatric Associates.

There is a Troop 111 handbook for all scouts, which looks like 20 pages, it is a welcome to Troop 111, it goes back through with the last page being a behavior and discipline policy, and then on the next to the last page it looks like an acknowledgment, this is the second revision, it was done in 1993, this revision was done in 2000, the second revision was done in 1993, the orange one was in 1980, it was revised in 2002, the 2000 revision was by Nick Turnes, and then it talks about the scout masters over the years, William Green, Charles Walsh, James Davidson, Edwin Young, Burke Wyatt, Herbert Wright, Paul Syms, Jack Tingon, Joe Sberik, Bob Johanson, Peter Ollive, Bill Hague, Bob Japenski, Jon Dare, David Milstein, Howard Jay and Nick Turnes, Junior. Is that too much detail, Rick, to go through or not?

MR. HASTY: Yes.
MR. SUMMERS: How do you want to go through the rest of this box?

MR. HASTY: Let's just go off the record for a minute.
(Off the record.)
MR. SUMMERS: We've gone through and we've just opened up the box and it contains a lot of it looks like new merit badge books, I took pictures of them. I looked at Personal Fitness, I'm looking at it, Personal Fitness, it is a 2008 printing, it looks like it is unused. The drafting merit badge does have Troop 111 on it. The merit badge books on computers, again computers, leather work, again leather work, graphic arts, citizenship and the nation, family life, fish and wildlife, electronics, soil and water, which is more used, personal fitness, two draftings, entrepreneurship, sportsman, cooking, backpacking, it's a 2001 printing of the 2008 edition, orienteering, music and bugling. There is a first aid merit badge, which looks pretty new, it's a printing date of 2004, copyright dated 2002, so we seem to be into actual merit badge items that were used, or at least purchased by Michael, environmental science.

There is the boy scout requirements for 2002 book, it has his name written on the edge, it has some blue cards in the pocket, blank blue cards and the 2008, 2006 requirements rather, it looks like it was used this book.

There is also something in here on auto mechanics, and then there is definitely his boy scout handbook based on the vintage and the use, it has Troop 111 on 2/9/02, so this appears to be the real thing, and the insert on the inside copy pocket is the troop discipline policy, and he has a yellow sheet of paper in here that looks like it's part of doing the personal fitness merit badge. It looks like his initial testing results, 3/21, he did one pullup, he can do 23 sit-ups, he can do four pushups and he ran a quarter mile in three minutes, ten seconds.

MR. HASTY: Okay. Now, this stuff came out of where now?

MR. SUMMERS: That came out of this box.
MR. HASTY: That box?
MR. SUMMERS: Yes, it was on top.
MR. HASTY: Here, can you put all that back in? This came out of that box?

MS. TIE: Right.
MR. HASTY: But they all have a red tab on them.

MS. TIE: Okay.
MR. SUMMERS: There are two sheets of paper in here clipped together, it's January 7, 2009, it is the PLC agenda and it's mentioning the Barefoot Mailman Hike
is in February, it's talking about a camp out in Juniper Springs and it gives the leaders for the different patrols, Cobras, Batman, Gators, Evan Quinn was in charge of Batman. The insert happens to be Chapter 11, Page 294, and that's the first aid or stop breathing section. The back pages for the index of the book are coming out apparently from use. This book has been used. Also, in here are several patches still in the bags and never sewn on, quality unit patches for 2005, 2006, 2007. Is that first class?

MR. WINSBY: I think so.

MR. SUMMERS: There is a first class scout badge sewn on the 111 for the troop number, never sewn on. There is a life patch that wasn't used, a training patch. There are two cobra patches, two Order of the Arrow patches, a panda patch, a junior leader training patch, which may indicate that he's been to JLT and these are all unused patches still in the bag.

Another belt buckle, some beads, a Merit Badge College name tag from some year and then quite a few participatory patches, 2003 Markham Park, Disney World. There is the Mike Machuk Trail patch from Tom Akita, 2002 Seminole Chorus, 2004 Merit Badge College, 2003 Merit Badge College, a 911 patch from 2002, a Scout Master Jamboree in 2005, Scout Master Jamboree in 2003, Scout

Shabbat in '02, Scout Master's Camp '02, New River District 2001, Camp Seminole, 2002 Pine Island District, Ten Commandment Hike. There is something I can't read, it's a needle with a watch which matches the shirt we saw, Scout Sunday patch, another Merit Badge College name tag, this is from 2007, some beads and the red scout shoulder patches. That finishes this. There are two big banners.

This looks like probably patrol banners done by the adults, the Bison Patrol, it gives the names of at least three boys who were in it, six boys who were it. The backside of it, another what looks -- this is another patrol. These are the Vikings and it has eight people in it and it's parent made.

We requested the telephone numbers, and those were objected to, so I think in light of this, we need to just follow up with a letter, that's the kind of thing that we should be given at this point. I think that's the way we move quickly with this. Ready to start on the next one? I'm going to pile it out, take a picture of it, talk about it.

MR. HASTY: Okay.
MR. WINSBY: I think I had one of these.
MR. SUMMERS: I had two. These pants are unused. We're on box two of five, it looks like it's
mostly new clothes. We have three scout shirts that never had the emblems sewn on them, they are all large. We have two caps that look new, there is no grime on the inside and they are still tucked in at the back. We have two pair of shorts that are 38 s that have never had a name written on the label. We have two belts, one of the belts has had a name written on it and it has a buckle on it, the other belt doesn't have a buckle. We have a troop handkerchief. We have two red troop T-shirts, extra large, extra large, a Camp Raven blue shirt from the year they went to summer camp, another one of these commando camps in Alabama.

There is a large Sky Mont, tan T-shirt for the Cherokee Area Council, which is a summer camp, it's a large. We have one regular pair of socks and then two of the ankle socks, scout socks, a patch from the Cherokee Area Council, 2006, indicating they went to summer camp then. There is a ribbon with a number of cub scout pins on it, Arrow of Life, fleur-de-lis, the different wolves there, and without my glasses I can't see the third square patch.

There is an eagle scout sash, 13 rows of three for 36. The last item is the telephone, it's still sealed in an evidence bag. On the front it says, "Evidence/Property," the agency is CCSO, the case number
is 09-13213, offense, death investigation, Michael is identified, the date and time of recovery is nine -- the date and time of recovery is 5/9/09 and 2300, recovered by Eric RN, next is written "NCII," that's probably Detective O'Neil, inscription, location, Samsung phone, plastic bag, NCH, downtown, which is probably the Naples hospital.

MR. HASTY: It is Naples Community Hospital.
MR. SUMMERS: And it looks like this is a plastic evidence bag, but inside the plastic evidence bag it must be that the Samsung cell phone is in a bag.

MR. HASTY: Which for the record was not in the Rule 26 disclosure.

MR. SUMMERS: It's a red Samsung, T-Mobil, if that helps. With no objection, we're going into box one of five.

MR. HASTY: Now, this red notebook came out of something, $I$ don't know what it came out of.

MS. TIE: That came out of box two.
MR. HASTY: Did we do box two?
MR. SUMMERS: We just did that. Why don't we talk about that red notebook and then I'll put it in box two? Do you have a summary of what's in it? I think maybe we started looking at this unofficially. This is a red, three-inch binder that seems to contain items on
merit badges, and briefly thumbing through I see the blue cards, which are important, they are in plastic folders, so this is going to be a pretty good documentation of the camp outs and group activities and merit badges.

There is a schedule from -- there is sort of a ripped out section that shows some merit badges, these are partial merit badges; for example, we start with emergency prep on 6/17/05 and he still needs requirements two, three and eight, it also discusses communications, checkbox inventory sheet, some e-mails on the atmosphere, a number of loose pages, personal management, auto mechanics, computers, public speaking, safe exploration, surveying and plumbing, it sounds like he's thinking of taking them, or took them all at the same time. There is a page on plants, a hike write-up, hike number three, March of '05, Collier-Seminole State Park, so this would be a write-up he's doing for the hiking merit badge, writing up hike number three in the Everglades in 2005. It says, "It's mostly mud covered water, people losing their shoes, mosquitos, hot, humid, minimum plants."

MR. HASTY: Let's just get that copied, the whole thing cover to cover.

MR. SUMMERS: The whole folder?
MR. HASTY: Yes.
MR. SUMMERS: Do you want anything mentioned
about what's in it? How do you want to do it, Rick?
MR. HASTY: I think you could just kind of breeze through it real quick, because we're going to run out of time here.

MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Meetings set out up through Thanksgiving of one year, camp outs and dates and Merit Badge College. Youth leader training at Tumc, he's been through some youth training it appears, or at least he was scheduled for it, plants for a hike. He has a hike plan in here, distance is 14.7 miles, talking about sunscreen, eyeglasses, hats, socks, shoes, something on public participation, probably a citizenship merit badge, Old Cutler hike, December 2006, this is his write-up on the Old Cutler hike, a diagram probably of an emergency exit plan, something on population and community, that would be for a citizenship merit badge, projects around the house, taking out trash, vacuuming, that's probably the family merit badge is what it looks like, feed the fish, he's writing up activities for family is my guess, mow the grass.

He has the printouts for the personal management requirements. Personal management, he has to come up with his income. This is his sheet for three months of personal management finances, there is one entry 12/28/03. There is expenses and income, he does
track it for about two weeks in October of '03. On another sheet, family life, he tracks all of his chores, family life requirements, University of Scouting packet from '04, a stamp showing the Inverrary Post Office in '05, March Disney camp out '04, talking about money still owed, camp out planner, duty patrol projects, a coin collecting merit badge, an '06 coin collecting merit badge at the troop meeting, Sky Mont merit badge scheduler from summer camp, daily summer camp schedule from '06 and general camp information, a lot of stuff off the internet from Sky Mont, a letter to Representative Martinez in 2005 for the citizenship requirements, environmental science and merit badge taught by Linda Vedsted, Michael Rico, eagle scout project from September of some year, e-mails on various activities, a list of counselors for the eagle merit badges. These look like troop people. This is something we want to make sure we have, it looks like it's --

MR. HASTY: You want to mark that separately here?

MR. SUMMERS: Five pages.
MR. HASTY: We can just do that now. Put that in the stack.

MR. SUMMERS: Summer camp 2007.
MS. TIE: You want just that page out of that
binder?
MR. SUMMERS: That's probably four or five pages.

MS. TIE: Well, yes.
MR. HASTY: We're going to want that right away, whereas the other stuff, I don't know how long it's going to take.

MR. SUMMERS: There is a February of ' 07 note on a summer camp in North Carolina.

MR. HASTY: What year is that?
MR. SUMMERS: '07, courses for Star life and Eagle Scouts is down here. This looks like a three page printout from Merit Badge College. There is a Troop 111 leadership evaluation while he's star rank. It looks like there is discussion of whether he gets credit for a troop leader position, so we should have that copied, and then there is attached to it one page talking about what patrol leaders do.

Then there is a folder, then there is an envelope for the scholarship merit badge and it has school grades, so we're going to want a copy of this envelope. Continuing through the book, Mother's Day '05, then several blank pages, then a sheet called, "Advancements," so these are going to contain his rank advancements and his blue cards and merit badge books,
his merit badge cards. The rank advancements through Star Scout, one page, then there are five pages of merit badge cards and the last page has three on it and the last ones are communications in '08, space exploration is in '08 and geology in '08.

MR. HASTY: Why don't you start making a list of what's in that pile?

MR. SUMMERS: He had some blue cards, which is starting out with the high school counselor then was Fred Martin, $I$ don't know the date that this hiking merit badge card was started, it doesn't have the counselor Fred Martin's signature. These must be partials, because none of these are signed, one of these is signed, astronomy is signed by Mr. Quinn, hiking, architecture, drafting and personal fitness, another second personal fitness.

Fishing and wilderness survival are not
signed. It looks like personal fitness at Raven, again somewhere else, the first time was summer camp, the next time would have been in a troop atmosphere. Then the next item some signed blue cards, Linda Vedsted. There is a Citizenship in the Nation signed by her on three of '05, personal management signed on 12 of '06, Citizenship of the World isn't signed, the environmental science is signed by Linda in four of '06, communications is signed
by Linda on five of '08, public speaking five of '07, environmental science is one, communications, personal management is shown as completed 1/17/07, but I don't see a signature and then there is some committee member cards for the parents. The father's card was good till December of '08, the mother's card was good till December of '08, his card was good until December of '08, there is another card that was good for the mother that was good till the end of January of '06.

The last thing in here is a hike plan for hiking around Plantation, the area west of the Plantation golf course, west and north of it, another one for Markham Park, cycling merit badge worksheet, the first two-and-a-half pages is a city commission meeting form.

There is a medical in here for August of '04, the best I can read the doctor's name is G. Pecedy, P-E-C-E-D-Y, oh, here it is, Gil Paredes, P-A-R-E-D-E-S, Pediatric Associates in Weston, we want a copy of that. There is one page that shows a merit badge completed in '03, a Merit Badge College, a list of merit badge prerequisites, all of these things are associated with Merit Badge College, a printout of his history going up to star, it's two pages, we'll get a copy of that, I can't tell the date, 10/27/04. There is a workup for the home repairs merit badge was the start of it, some more,
another personal progress report from '06, we'll get a copy of that.

Trail to eagle personal fitness, it looks like it's well worn. There are about eight pages estimating, not counting the exercise activity $\log$ is not filled out. It looks like he's gone through the classroom portion of the merit badge, it gives the impression of having been done in troop meetings or by the troop, I don't see a date on it, it does show he took the starting test, he did the one mile run in ten minutes and 43 seconds, he did 38 sit-ups, he did 26 pushups, they took the measurements of his body, so none of that is filled in.

There is another one personal fitness merit badge requirements, it's in better shape, it looks like it's unused, it says, "Period one," so it looks like it went -- it looks like it was associated with the Merit Badge College, nothing in here is filled out, so I will not make a copy of it, it's blank. I'm going to write on the very top of this, which is the top document, it's personal fitness, I'm going to write "Red book" to show where it came from.

MR. HASTY: I don't think this was opened here.

MR. SUMMERS: This goes in box two.
MR. HASTY: I'm going through what appears to
be a bag of sympathy cards, there is another bag in there. We need to go ahead and catalog whatever else is in there. We're going to want this copied. That's the funeral service at the temple.

MR. SUMMERS: I'll take a picture of it right here. We are on box one which is the last box. There are some merit badge books, camping, with the word "1999" written in the upper right. On the insert it says, "Property of Troop 111," and the revision is 1997, printing date 1999. There is an archaeology book which is the '97 version, the '97 revision. There is a first aid book, it looks pretty well worn, it has a stamp on it it says, "Property of Troop 111, Plantation United Methodist Church," it has a stamp of the troop on the inside cover, "ENF" is written in there, the date it was copyrighted is 1998 and it doesn't have a separate printing date.

There is a youth leadership certificate, so he did go to JLT and that's the -- or YLT rather, September of '08. There is a plastic bag containing the book on knots, three pens and some folded up blank white paper. The book, "Knots and how to tie them," it's copyrighted 1978, it looks unused. There are shirts again, the red Troop 111 shirt, "Where Eagles Sore," it's an XL, it looks like it might not have been worn. There is a Troop

III dark black, or I guess this one is black, it's an XL, it might have been washed. There is a ribbon for South Florida Council 45th, Scout Master's Camporee, this is a patrol flag, third place, this would be something belonging to the troop. There is a pin given in support of a donation to The South Florida Council, it looks like it's still in the box, the funeral handout, I'm looking for a date on it.

MR. HASTY: That came out of the packet of condolence cards or sympathy cards, that's where that came from.

MR. SUMMERS: The date is May 12th, 2009, I'll take a copy of that. There is a Flamingo Gardens walking map handout. Does anybody know where Flamingo Gardens is?

MS. TIE: It's on Flamingo and almost by Griffin.

MR. SUMMERS: Okay. There is a name card for the Merit Badge College in 2008 and something in one of the pockets. There is something that cinches the cord, a lot of patches, there is a Sky Mont chaplain's aide, a patrol leader's patch, none of these have been used by the way, a Mission Possible 2007, Friends of Scouting, Congregational Church, Old Cutler Hike from 2006 patch, aquatics, environmental 2008, Scout Master's Jamboree,

2006 Friends of Scouting patch, a Merit Badge College 15th anniversary patch, it looks like it's the tenth year Scout Master's Camporee patch, maybe 2007, a troop guide patch that has never been used, a scout Sunday patch, a Sky Mont reservation 2006 patch. There is a code of honor from March 25, 2009 handout, at least six pages. I see the scout master's comments is done by Howard Crompton.

MR. HASTY: Let's make a separate copy of that.

MR. SUMMERS: This we need a copy of. The Life to Eagle advisors are Doug Beals, who is listed as trained and Patty Geyer, health and safety is Rosemarie Novak, the assistant scout master's first assistant is Chris Zimmerman, the first year scout advisor is Bradley Schmidt, the Batman patrol advisor is Larry Abrams, the Cobra advisor is Doug Beals, the quartermaster is Jim Rice, the senior patrol leader is Nikh Mohip, the assistant patrol leader is Sam Kent.

MR. HASTY: Let's get a copy of that.
MR. SUMMERS: There is a schedule here. Then there is a May 28, '08 code of honor, the same type of thing, this one has also I guess it's stapled together, please be careful with that. There is an envelope to Michael and the family, the Eagle Code of Honor for

Bradley Schmidt, dinner following ceremony, so it's an invitation. Then there is a program for Brad Schmidt's Eagle ceremony, we'll make a copy of that and there is a program for November of '08 for Andrew Novak, we'll make a copy of that.

Then it looks like there is a bound document with printouts dated in May 2009 that appears to be Facebook type entries after the death, so we want a copy of that, it also includes some newspaper articles, then there is a packet of documents here, one written, two pages after the death about three weeks ago, I assume that means high school, and not signed by anyone, troop committee minutes of August of '08, some other troop agendas and then the Troop 111 Life to Eagles as of April of '08. I think we should just copy all of this.

MR. HASTY: Yes, just do it. Instead of putting it on the record --

MR. SUMMERS: This is a pack about an inch or more thick, it contains the Life to Eagle records and some different programs for activities the troop is doing. There is a parent permission form for 2007 and 2008. Let me back up.

There is a medical form and health insurance form. This one is a May '08 version and then there is the parent permission form for ' 07 , ' 08. Then there is
the class three medical science signed 5/17/08. There is a class three medical form, this one is dated 5/17/08 and it's signed by the pediatrician we've seen before.

MR. HASTY: Let's put that in the stack over there.

MR. SUMMERS: This one $I$ think we've seen, because that's the one at the time of the hike. In the original packet, it came right after the ' 07 , ' 08 parent permission form. The next document now is the financial report on the troop in April much '08.

MR. HASTY: And we're going to get these three slips or one card and two letters copied from the sympathy stack.

MR. SUMMERS: Then there is a merit badge counselor information on different merit badge counselors, Howard Adelman is listed, the mother is listed as a merit draft counselor in drafting, art and landscape architecture, then there is what we've seen before the Troop 111 merit badge procedures, then there is a one page write-up that appears to be in Michael's handwriting, "The Benefits of Scouting," then there are some miscellaneous pages, it might have been the Buffalo Patrol, some checkoffs of some different first names, it looks like stuff they are going to bring to different camp outs, also Viking, so he must have been a Viking
patrol, he's a patrol with Collin, Nicole, Kim, maybe Kris with a K and Sam.

There is a volunteer leader application that is not filled out, merit badge counselor information, apparently counselors within the troop, the father is listed as graphic arts, home repairs, fish and wildlife management. Under, "Graphic arts," it says he's been in the printing business for 20 years, Doug Beals is the counselor for emergency preparedness, fireman-ship, hiking -- the list is skills stemming from being a fire fighter, EMT and in the Marine Corp, Drew Novak's Eagle project is here for February of some year, it looks like a map for a hike.

There is a November of 2006 one page calendar and on the back are notes about Peace River, it must have been the Peace River camp out, the agenda from 10 of '06, architectural merit badge requirements. Then there is an individual progress to Michael at age 15, PLC November of '06, Patrol Grub Master Planning Guide, PLC from May '06, rules for camp out procedures, he was in biking patrol at that point, then some information on patrol emblems, PLC of April of '06, then there are emergency and hurricane plans, PLC 9/06, then a map for Oleta River State Park, a blank PLC meeting form, then a February of ' 06 Big Cypress camp out form. He did wilderness survival
requirements, as well as other activities.
MR. HASTY: Let's get those.
MR. SUMMERS: PLC February of '06.
MR. HASTY: Let's put those in the immediate copy area.

MR. SUMMERS: These aren't that exciting.
MR. HASTY: All right. Okay.
MR. SUMMERS: Scout Master Camporee '04, Scout Master Camporee February of '06, with schedules associated with that next down, so I assume they go together, PLC, February of '07.

There is a Pine Island District on-line training options printout that is undated, it shows you protection, safe swim, safety -- boy scout leader, first troop committee challenge and then it has duties as a patrol leader, then what the troop guide duties are, the National Youth Leadership training, an Eagle Claw participation form that's not filled out, camp out duty roster that's not filled out, a PLC agenda January of '07, a membership evaluation form which isn't signed, but it is filled out, it looks like filled out by Michael, he was in the Viking/Bison.

Then there is a Nova High School National Honor Society, summer of '07 form, and it shows the people who were officers, Kim Jones, Joyce Wang, last
name -- the first name of the treasurer is Nandini, last name is Brina, the secretary was Libby Hunt, then Eve Colebrett, Sara Gibson. I don't see Michael's name on here, National Honor Society, membership application '06, '07, he filled this out in tenth grade. His grade point average was 3.2857 and the requirement was that you have a 30 grade point. He's sponsored by AO Connor or A O'Connor in the science department and then there is a write-up from Schmidt of $3 / 7 / 07$, which sounds like a recommendation letter, talking about Michael demonstrating leadership in his patrol by creating a patrol flag and flag pole, so we'll get a copy of that quickly.

Then there is a folder Bison flag and it has a layout of the Bison flag, which we've seen. Then there is some drawing of something six-foot high, my guess best I can do holding the flag up. Then there are directions to somewhere on maybe Key Largo. There is an e-mail from 6/06 from Doug to Howard on the aviation merit badge, I believe that would be Doug Beals, I assume.

Then there is a 6/06 e-mail from Chris

Zimmerman to someone named Kris, Chris Zimmerman is an architect, they are talking about community healthcare and shotgun merit badges and it looks like everything just started, Chris Roberts and also Patty Geyer is
involved, Chris is not -- let's see, Patty is not going to summer camp in '06. Chris is saying he's not going to summer camp in '06, he wants to do some merit badges.

Then there is a brown folder that contains two pages, it looks like a write-up after his death, it is from Christopher Patrick Geyer-Roberts and we'll just get a copy of this upfront. I'll put these in the box. This book that says, "Michael," it looks like a subscribed book.

MR. HASTY: We're going to want to get copies of these photos, just these, not all of them, there are a bunch. How do you want me to do this? Take these out how? There are four photos that I want.

MS. TIE: I know.
MR. SUMMERS: This notebook has I'll guess eight pages, the first three are written on, the first one is full, the second one is two-thirds full, the third one is half of two-thirds full. I assume this is after his death, it's not entirely clear; yes, it's after his death. There is an entry by Vedsted, "With humor and wit, your smiling face will sorely be missed. With all my love, Ms. Vedsted." There is a plastic bag with some very basic printouts from 3/30/07 on the internet on second class scout and first class merit badges, all of these are the same date.

There is an e-mail from Michael 7/22/06, a letter to The New York Times, my guess this is associated with the citizenship merit badge. He's writing a letter about re-drawing political lines. There is an estimate in here on a piece of paper on camp spending, then there is a one page communications requirements and it's a sales plan, it looks like it's work on a merit badge, then there is a personal management write-up and it is filled in, it starts in 6/12 with an allowance and money spent and the balance, it looks like he ends up with zero money near the end, but he goes through September 13th and that will be for the personal management requirements. Then there is a blue something, maybe Rick knows what this is. Rick tells me it's a cooking apron, I'm not sure what it's associated with, but something with scouting. Then there is a packet of correspondence, the top one is May 14, 2009, so you assume these are condolence letters.

MR. HASTY: I've been through all of them.
MR. SUMMERS: Do you want copies of these?
MR. HASTY: No, I cherry-picked what I want out of there. I'm dealing with the second envelope now.

MR. SUMMERS: Okay. There is something here that looks like a mini Bible, perpetual membership in the --

MR. HASTY: It's a mass dedication.
MR. SUMMERS: Being Catholic, I didn't know what it was, Union City, New Jersey, it's May 9 of '09. What is Hattiesburg forensics, do you know?

MR. HASTY: Hattiesburg, Mississippi, it's a kid on the debate team met him and sent a sympathy card when he learned about his death. This stack is probably five inches tall. Off the record.
(Off the record.)
