1 MR. HASTY: Okay. We are here November 24th
2 to conduct the inspection of documents in the matter of
3 Howard Adelman and Judith Sclawy, as co-personal
4 representatives of the estate of Michael Sclawy Adelman,
5 case number 10-CV-22236-ASG. And present as defense
6 counsel are?

7 MR. SUMMERS: Bill Summers on behalf of the
8 Boy Scouts.

9 MR. WINSBY: Joseph Winsby on behalf of the
10 Plantation United Methodist Church.

11 MR. HASTY: And my name is Frederick Hasty on
12 behalf of Howard Crompton and Andrew Schmidt, the
13 defendants.

14 So, we're going to look at the production of
15 documents pursuant to Federal Rule 26 from the
16 plaintiffs, and we're going to identify what is here as
17 best we can. If we have questions, we will then pose
18 them to the plaintiff's counsel, who are not present in
19 the room, but have a representative law clerk present.

20 MR. SUMMERS: I'll start with, there are boxes
21 one through five the way they are labeled and there seems
22 to be about five of the large boxes that contains the
23 backpack, a Camel backpack.

24 Looking in the compartments, starting with the
25 back going forward, the first compartment has a towel and

1 it has a Quaker chewy.

2 MR. HASTY: Get the flavor there, because
3 there are several.

4 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Honey nut. Then in the
5 main compartment, I pulled out a Camel back water pack,
6 which is used as a hose to drink from, I don't see the
7 size on it.

8 MR. HASTY: It doesn't matter.

9 MR. SUMMERS: It's at least a quart, it's
10 pretty standard issue backpack. There is an orange
11 pouch, let's see what's in it, inside the pouch are a
12 pair of socks that haven't been used.

13 MR. HASTY: Boy Scout socks.

14 MR. SUMMERS: Boy Scout socks. There is what
15 looks like a bandage, a towelette, it's in a plastic bag,
16 it's toilet paper, about a one-inch roll. Then there is
17 a Trek One first aid kit, brand name Coghlan's. Do you
18 want to list the contents?

19 MR. HASTY: Yes.

20 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. It looks like a pretty
21 standard hiking -- it has three dry wipes, which look
22 like they are probably dried out, but not open. It's got
23 six large Band-Aids, it has five -- six large Band-Aids,
24 two small Band-Aids and I guess these are the things put
25 on your nose to breathe that you see the football players

1 with them. It has something about a one-by-two inch
2 strip that I probably would call mole skin, also used for
3 hiking. There is a piece from the back of a Band-Aid,
4 which shows that there must have been a Band-Aid used at
5 some point, do you see this?

6 MR. HASTY: Yes.

7 MR. SUMMERS: I'm showing that. We have a
8 roll of tape, I can't tell if it is gauze, but it is
9 probably adhesive tape. There is an Instant Guide to
10 First Aid here, I'll come back to that. There is also
11 several additional items of mole skin, it looks like they
12 are three-by-four inches, there are three of those, and
13 there is a partial piece which is about two inches by two
14 inches, it has been cut from a larger piece at one time.
15 There is a larger Band-Aid. There is a gauze pad, a
16 three-by-three gauze pad, it looks like there are four of
17 those.

18 The Instant Guide to First Aid has a needle in
19 it it pulls out. You might want to get a copy of this,
20 Rick? The thing is covered here, it covers quite a bit,
21 including heat exhaustion, heart attack and heat stroke.

22 MR. HASTY: Just read what --

23 MR. SUMMERS: "Heat exhaustion," I'm going to
24 go with heart attack, too. "Heart attack, pain in the
25 chest, three columns, "Injury, symptoms and treatment,

1 heart attack, pain in the chest, shoulders, lower jaw,
2 upper arm, complaints of heartburn or indigestion,
3 blue/gray pallor, sweating, apprehension, distress,
4 denial. The treatment is arrange for transportation or
5 seek medical assistance -- sit in a position of comfort,
6 usually semi-sitting, monitor vital signs, be prepared to
7 assist with CPR."

8 Next with, "Heat exhaustion, cool, clammy
9 skin, weak, rapid pulse, rapid, shallow breathing. The
10 treatment, move to a cooler area if possible, remove
11 extra clothing, treat for shock. Recovery should follow
12 a short rest, otherwise seek medical care."

13 Heat stroke is the third item, "Rapid onset,
14 hot, dry, flushed skin, initial, rapid pulse, decreasing
15 progressively, twitching, convulsions. The treatment is
16 quickly cool the person, remove clothing, fan, wrap in a
17 sheet and sprinkle with water, stabilize and monitor
18 vitals, transport."

19 I'm going to read stroke, because one of them
20 referred to stroke. Under stroke, the second column
21 reads, "Inability to speak, one side of the face appears
22 flaccid or sagging, one pupil larger than the other, slow
23 pulse, one-sided paralysis. Treatment, transport,
24 medical aid in a position of comfort, often semi-prone or
25 semi-sitting, monitor vitals and assist with AR or CPR,"

1 I think we should probably get a copy of this.

2 MR. HASTY: Yes. In the backpack, there was
3 also this, put on the record, there are four peanut
4 Nature Valley bars, two packs of Orbit gum containing 14
5 pieces in each which are mint, five Nature Valley oat and
6 honey bars, a container of Neutrogena Ultra Sheer Body
7 Mist Sunblock, SPF 70, Neutrogena Ultra Sheer Dry Touch
8 Sunblock, lightweight, clean ointment, SPF 70, a National
9 Parks Systems map and guide which has the Big Cypress,
10 it's an actual map. On the back there are -- there is
11 information about the national park system guide.

12 MR. SUMMERS: I'm putting everything back in
13 the orange bag. I also note that there are some either
14 peanuts or flakes from it looks like one of the power
15 bars.

16 MR. HASTY: Did you go in this section here?

17 MR. SUMMERS: No.

18 MR. HASTY: This is more tubing, another pack.

19 MR. SUMMERS: What we found as part of the
20 Camel backpack, it contains it's own water bladder, so
21 there is a water bladder inside the backpack and then
22 there is a separate water bottle, Camel back that's
23 actually separate from the back, it probably can be
24 strapped on the back of the pack.

25 MR. HASTY: Does it say --

1 MR. WINSBY: This is a Camel bladder that we
2 found within the smaller compartment of the backpack and
3 it reads, "80 ounces."

4 MR. SUMMERS: That has -- you see it?

5 MR. HASTY: It's own bottle.

6 MR. SUMMERS: It's the same basic --

7 MR. HASTY: It says "100" here, that's 100
8 ounces. That takes care of that pack.

9 MR. SUMMERS: Did you check this side?

10 MR. HASTY: I did not.

11 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. In the side pocket on the
12 right-hand side there is an oats honey wrapper. The
13 other side pocket on the left-hand side is empty. There
14 is a capital "M" written inside the back of the backpack.

15 MR. HASTY: In this box we have two
16 certificates of appreciation to Howard Adelman, one is
17 dated September 10th, 2008, one is dated September 27th,
18 2006. In 2006, it says, "For dedication and service for
19 Scouts Troop 111 as a 2006 summer camp leader, Sky Mont
20 Reservation, Altamonte, Tennessee," and that's the one
21 dated September 27th, signed by Andy Schmidt as the scout
22 master and Linda Vedsted as committee chair. Then the
23 other certificate is to Howard Adelman, "In
24 appreciation," dated September 10th, 2008 for summer camp
25 adult leader, Camp Raven Knob, Mont Airy, North Carolina

1 and this is, again, signed by Andy Schmidt and Howard
2 Crompton, committee chair. Just take a picture there.

3 There is also a certificate or a plaque to
4 Howard Adelman and that is dated September 28, 2005 for
5 being an adult leader, summer camp at Camp Sequoyah,
6 Delta, Alabama in September 28, 2005, signed by Andy
7 Schmidt, scout master, and Linda Vedsted, committee
8 chair. You got that, right?

9 MR. SUMMERS: Yes.

10 MR. HASTY: There is a troop name badge.

11 MR. SUMMERS: For both parents.

12 MR. HASTY: And then from the same box are
13 some badges.

14 MR. SUMMERS: These are position bangs.

15 MR. HASTY: Yes.

16 MR. SUMMERS: These are advancement badges and
17 it looks like this is a beaver patrol badge, patrol
18 leader badge, assistant patrol leader badge, quality unit
19 2000 badge, South Florida Council 2003 arm patch. This
20 is one of the -- what is that? It's a round patch with a
21 red arrow on it and then it has the ranks up through
22 first class.

23 MR. HASTY: Take a picture of that. Then we
24 have "The Boy Scout Handbook, A Guide to Adventure, A
25 Guidebook for Life." This book is --

1 MR. SUMMERS: It looks like it's untouched.
2 This may be a very new one.

3 MR. HASTY: Yes, I was looking for the date.

4 MR. SUMMERS: I can find that probably. It
5 goes beyond this. The parent's guide is still in there.

6 MR. HASTY: It's the 12th Edition.

7 MR. SUMMERS: It's the 12th Edition, copyright
8 2009, so we're looking at something published in the year
9 2009 or 2010, it has a cover with an eagle and at the top
10 there are some kids on a raft. Based on the way it looks
11 on the edges, I don't think it has ever really been
12 opened up.

13 MR. HASTY: And we have the merit badge series
14 for hiking, Boy Scouts of America. Let's see if we can
15 find a date.

16 MR. SUMMERS: It might have been used, but
17 it's not marked. It's a 2009 printing. Take a picture
18 of that. There is a field book here, fourth edition,
19 copyright 2004, it shows Roy Williams as the chief scout
20 executive, it doesn't seem to have had much use. Then
21 there are some merit badge books on emergency
22 preparedness, camping, first aid and personal fitness.

23 MR. HASTY: Let's get the dates.

24 MR. SUMMERS: Personal fitness has no marks in
25 it, it doesn't appear to have much, if any, use, it's the

1 2010 printing of the 2009 revision. The first aid merit
2 badge is 2010 printing of the 2007 copyright. All of
3 these appear to be very recent and unused. The camping
4 merit badge book is the 2010 printing of the 2005
5 copyright. The emergency preparedness merit badge is the
6 2008 printing of the 2008 copyright.

7 MR. HASTY: Those clothes, was he wearing
8 those clothes? Are those his clothes that he owned?

9 MS. TIE: I am not sure.

10 MR. SUMMERS: None of these merit badges seem
11 to show much, if any, use. There are actually six boxes,
12 aren't they? One is a priority mailbox.

13 MS. TIE: Actually, those are separate out of
14 those boxes.

15 MR. SUMMERS: Which one? The big one?

16 MS. TIE: The books are not in that.

17 MR. HASTY: They were kept separate.

18 MR. SUMMERS: So in the number six box, that
19 was the certificates, the cloth patches, the name tag and
20 the plaque.

21 MR. HASTY: Two certificates, one plaque.
22 This was a separate pile.

23 MR. SUMMERS: So there are six boxes and three
24 piles and three tubes.

25 MR. HASTY: What box number is that?

1 MR. WINSBY: This is box number four of five.

2 MR. HASTY: Four of five. These appear to be
3 clothes.

4 MR. SUMMERS: These are class Bs and class A
5 uniform, one for the troop, Troop 111. Let's just see.
6 The dark brown and black, it's a large. There is a Merit
7 Badge College white T-shirt, large, I don't see a year on
8 that. There is a pair of classic scout shorts.

9 MR. HASTY: Another troop T-shirt.

10 MR. SUMMERS: The same size?

11 MR. HASTY: It's a large.

12 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. We'll take a picture of
13 that. The next T-shirt is "Opportunity is now," anything
14 on the back of that one?

15 MR. HASTY: No, it's a large. Let's go off
16 the record for a minute.

17 (Off the record.)

18 MR. SUMMERS: Another T-shirt, "The ultimate
19 Summer Camp Experience, Survivor Camp," I don't know what
20 that is. Where do the words start and stop? "Camp Comer
21 Camp Sequoyah, Greater Alabama Council."

22 MR. HASTY: I think it's camp -- Comer Camp
23 Sequoyah, Great Alabama Council.

24 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Hold that up for us.
25 There is a troop cap. There are some arm braids which

1 were probably for a troop guide. There is a Boy Scout
2 shirt, it's a mens' large, it shows a scribe, it has a
3 "Trained patch," which you normally see on adults, it has
4 a Life Scout emblem on the left front pocket and it has
5 the patch from the Scout Master's Camp 30th anniversary
6 in 2009. Take a picture of that.

7 MR. HASTY: Markham Park, Sunrise, Florida and
8 this is the scout master's camporee.

9 MR. SUMMERS: There is a pair of long pants,
10 scout pants, it has a minor's name written in them,
11 Michael's name written in there, a size 36 waist and they
12 are rolled up at the bottom about three inches.

13 MR. HASTY: Shorts, socks, T-shirts.

14 MR. SUMMERS: There is another pair of long
15 pants, size 38. When I say size 38, waist 38, a scruffy,
16 torn up T-shirt. It looks like this was probably what he
17 was wearing is my guess, it's been cut down the front.

18 MR. HASTY: That's the one he was using the
19 day he died?

20 MR. SUMMERS: Yes. This says, "United States
21 of America" on the front of it and on the patch it has
22 the troop identified, another pair of shorts, these are
23 size 38s, a scout belt with a buckle, another T-shirt,
24 this one has some paint on it, it's a Troop 111 T-shirt,
25 this one is dark green, another troop T-shirt 111 with

1 the label cut out, it looks like it's in pretty good
2 shape, another pair of shorts, these are size 38s, then
3 there are several pairs of socks. There are four of the
4 low-rise socks and it looks like seven-and-a-half pairs
5 of the high socks, not the very highest but the
6 mid-socks. Continuing with box four which contains
7 clothes.

8 MR. HASTY: You guys can do these.

9 MR. SUMMERS: Looking at the tubes --

10 MR. HASTY: There are three of them.

11 MR. WINSBY: They are differentiated from the
12 outside.

13 MR. SUMMERS: I opened one, it has a red
14 banner in it, it says, "Forever in our heart," and one of
15 them says, "Never forgotten, RIP, Michael," signed,
16 "Love, Molly," so this looks like this is after-the-fact.
17 This is a banner that is 10 or 15 feet long, maybe
18 longer, and it looks like maybe ten or so people signed
19 it, Sharon signed it, Moki signed it, Sara signed it,
20 Briana signed it, Laurel signed it, Chandler, Molly, Alex
21 Abreu, Courtney C., Natasha Logan, I'll try and read
22 this, T-A-T-I-A-N-N-A, last name, B-L-O-T, Amber, Sara
23 Davis. The next one, you have a more challenging
24 assignment than I have.

25 MR. WINSBY: I removed a large, brown paper

1 scroll from one of the white tubes, it contains a banner
2 that reads in part, "RIP." The banner in its entirety
3 reads, "From all at Nova High School, RIP, Michael
4 Sclawy," and there are many notes, apparently from the
5 students at Nova High School to Michael.

6 MR. HASTY: Why don't we start a pile then?

7 MS. TIE: Okay.

8 MR. HASTY: I'm looking at a notebook that
9 says, "The Michael Sclawy Adelman memory album," we're
10 going to want this whole document copied. There are a
11 lot of letters in here.

12 MR. SUMMERS: So you now in the three tubes,
13 we have the one red cloth banner with a little bit
14 written on it, we have one brown paper banner with a lot
15 written on it and then we have the third one, which is
16 another brown paper banner, and it has a medium amount
17 written on it. The first paper banner was full, this one
18 is I would say about half full. Rick, we will not finish
19 by noon.

20 MR. HASTY: No, I don't think so.

21 MR. SUMMERS: There are three boxes that we
22 haven't gone into.

23 MR. HASTY: Wait. Hold on. I'm almost done.
24 I have been going through the memory album and there is a
25 letter from Christine Chambers, is it Chambers or

1 Chombers? I think it's Chombers, C-H-O-M-B-E-R-S, and
2 then there is a letter from his sister, Elizabeth, which
3 are not actually in the three-ring binder, they are in
4 the folder or the slat of the three-ring binder, so we're
5 going to want to get those copied. I'm almost done here.
6 I'm going to want copies of that.

7 MR. SUMMERS: Right.

8 MR. HASTY: I'm done with this. I'd like to
9 get these today. The rest of these I could get next week
10 and the memory album, but this I would like to get today.

11 MR. SUMMERS: Let me take a picture of the
12 memory album.

13 MR. HASTY: It didn't flash.

14 MR. SUMMERS: No, it did not. As far as
15 these, we are looking at several scout publications,
16 there is The Health and Safety Guide, it looks new, it's
17 the 2006 printing.

18 MR. HASTY: The Passport to High Adventure.

19 MR. SUMMERS: 2008, it looks unused.

20 MR. HASTY: Scout master, assistant scout
21 master, leader, specific training.

22 MR. SUMMERS: He mentioned there is a CD ROM
23 enclosed, this is a 2010 printing, and it doesn't look
24 like it has been touched. There is a CD ROM in the back.

25 MR. HASTY: Is that the whole book on the ROM?

1 Third edition?

2 MR. SUMMERS: Very likely the --

3 MR. HASTY: I wonder if they could run that
4 right now, can you do that?

5 MS. TIE: I'm sorry?

6 MR. SUMMERS: There is a CD here, can you copy
7 it?

8 MS. TIE: I will check with the IT people.

9 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. So we're talking about
10 the scout master, assistant scout master, leader
11 training, so we'll try to get a copy of the CD ROM in the
12 back so we can walk out with that.

13 MR. HASTY: We'll just wait a minute, because
14 if that could be done, we may not have to copy it. This
15 has never been taken out?

16 MS. TIE: No.

17 MR. HASTY: So I'd have to break the seal, I'm
18 going to let you do that. Here, why don't you do that?
19 Either you could make a hard copy or if they can make a
20 copy of the CD ROM? I'm not going to break the seal.
21 You all decide how you want to handle it, it's your
22 property. We'll just go off the record for a minute.

23 (Off the record.)

24 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. We'll continue.

25 MR. HASTY: We could use a professional copy

1 service if that's what you want to do?

2 MS. TIE: Well, I mean, I don't know what the
3 total copying is going to be, so it would be kind of
4 better if you guys want to put together an entire pile of
5 things so we can decide if a professional copy service
6 would be easier, better, if all you want is a couple of
7 pages.

8 MR. HASTY: It's going to be a lot.

9 MR. SUMMERS: You don't want to do it
10 in-house?

11 MR. HASTY: The other issue is we have a time
12 constraint, the parents' depositions are coming up.

13 MS. TIE: Right.

14 MR. SUMMERS: The document we're looking at
15 now is, "Troop Program Features, Volume II," it is the
16 2007 printing. Then there is the Scout Master Handbook,
17 which is a white notebook, it is the 2009 printing. None
18 of these books appear to have been used. There is "The
19 Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills," which is the
20 2010 printing, with a copyright of 2000. There is "The
21 Troop Committee Guidebook," which is the 2008 printing of
22 the 1998 copyright, then there are quite a few internet,
23 well, maybe not. The first item on top is an internet
24 printout of two pages, "Sweet 16 VSA Safety," the website
25 is scouting.org/scoutsource/heathandsafety/sweet16, and

1 that was dated November 24th, 2010, so I guess that was
2 this morning. Then there is Treck Safety which has a
3 2003 copyright and this was copied out of a book. You
4 can see where the staple marks are in the upper left,
5 there are three pages, Seven Points of Treck Safety
6 Program, then there is a guide to safe scouting.

7 MS. TIE: That's the whole pile?

8 MR. SUMMERS: Yes. It probably was printed
9 off of the internet in color, it is a 2007 printing of
10 the 1998 copyright and this one has a total of 68 pages,
11 plus unnumbered pages that at the top say, "Notes," but
12 otherwise the page is blank, there are three of those.
13 Then there is one page, "Scouting Dollars." The next is,
14 "Support Scouting BSA Risk Ready," and the last page
15 is -- this contains the universal code and the Boy Scout
16 emblem and dress, so it's a guide to safe scouting of
17 some publication. Did we get the date on the scout
18 master handbook? Just to make sure, it is the 2009
19 printing. You have this notebook in front of you, and
20 the pages you talk about, how do you want to handle that?

21 MR. HASTY: I just need to get a copy.

22 MR. SUMMERS: The memory album?

23 MR. HASTY: Yes. There is a letter from
24 Elizabeth, his sister, and another young lady, with a
25 handwritten note, which is not a part of the three-ring

1 binder.

2 MR. SUMMERS: The one from Christine Chambers,
3 it's a full page --

4 MR. HASTY: I think it's Chombers.

5 MR. SUMMERS: Chombers, plus five lines on the
6 back of it, "PS," and the other one seems to be a
7 photocopy of a three page letter. I'll take a picture of
8 that. Those three boxes, we haven't opened any of that,
9 they are largely filled with paper.

10 MR. HASTY: This one is box number, it's
11 labeled three and five.

12 MR. SUMMERS: Why don't I say what they are?
13 What you are looking at this first page, that's probably
14 from first aid. Identifying poisonous plants, Page 318
15 is probably a reference to The Boy Scout Handbook, he's
16 identifying ivy, sumak, poison oak, which is a poisonous
17 plant and he identifies the different pages I believe
18 from the reference to the Boy Scout Handbook, how to
19 treat these problems.

20 We have printouts showing his schedule,
21 probably at Merit Badge College, it's on Saturday morning
22 and Saturday afternoon, so I'm 99 percent sure it's Merit
23 Badge College.

24 MR. WINSBY: All these documents are coming
25 from a red hanging folder.

1 MR. SUMMERS: Yes. We've got a family tree
2 that may be from a genealogy, a merit badge, then we have
3 some color pictures probably of their house, but it's of
4 the foliage around it. We have a printout. We have a
5 copy of the Family Life Requirement and then the
6 prerequisites. There is a blank page and the different
7 schedules. It looks like a second time he has gone to
8 Merit Badge College, this time with nature study and
9 genealogy, so that matches what we've just seen, it has
10 the requirements on reading merit badge, the requirements
11 on leather works. Rick, do you want me to record what
12 these are or just get a copy of them?

13 MR. HASTY: What is the word on the CD?

14 MS. TIE: I got ahold of Mark and I will go
15 ahead and make a copy of the letter from Elizabeth, that
16 I can give to you guys today, but as far as everything
17 else goes, if you guys want to put together a list of
18 everything you want copied because, obviously, it is
19 going to be a massive amount of paper and miscellaneous
20 items, that we're going to have to use a copy service to
21 take care of that? So if you guys just want to keep a
22 running tab of what you want?

23 MR. SUMMERS: I think we're going to stack
24 them at the end of the table.

25 MR. HASTY: Well, we need to identify it, make

1 sure we get it, that's the problem.

2 MR. SUMMERS: Then I'll read through it.

3 MR. HASTY: Yes.

4 MR. SUMMERS: Continuing through the red
5 hanging folder, it's the list of things to do before
6 Scout Masters, probably a reference to the scout master's
7 camp out and he has service project and Riverside
8 Regional.

9 MR. HASTY: She says start stacking what we
10 want copied.

11 MR. SUMMERS: Do you want a copy of this?

12 MR. HASTY: I do.

13 MR. SUMMERS: Inside the red hanging folder is
14 a blue folder with his name on the front. There is a
15 loose sheet in here that is identifying plants,
16 casterdine, sea grapes, "Project idea, kill as many wasps
17 who build nests as possible at my house," otherwise the
18 folder has about 40 pages of blank noted paper. Then
19 there is a reservation schedule for Merit Badge College,
20 the printout date is November 2003 and three other merit
21 badges, plus a December 2003 note from scout master Nick
22 Turnes, Junior of Troop 111, talking about prerequisites
23 done for citizenship in the community. There is a white
24 envelope that apparently one time contained firemen's
25 chit. There is a yellow notebook pad that contains

1 doodling on the second page, on the first page it looks
2 like the start of a genealogy tree.

3 I have a note in here on plantation utility
4 spending, so that is going to be part of one of the
5 citizenships, probably citizenship and community,
6 something on basketry. Then there is a printout of a
7 schedule, which is similar to the one we've seen before,
8 from the '03 Merit Badge College, the requirements for
9 reading merit badge, minutes from the City of Plantation
10 council, which would be for the citizenship merit badge,
11 basketry instructions and use, requirement one is a two
12 page set of requirements on reading, then requirements on
13 citizenship immunity, all this matches for the '03 Merit
14 Badge College citizenship in the community requirements,
15 a troop meeting schedule for 2003, 2004, which is useful,
16 and it goes over the different merit badges they are
17 going to be covering in their troop meeting for the new
18 scouts and the older scouts, a crime prevention merit
19 badge e-mail from September of 2003, a white sheet with
20 his name and phone number on it, troop electronics and a
21 PLC meeting set in August, it must have been a Disney
22 camp out in June of one year and it says, "Viking
23 opening."

24 There is a PLC meeting for March 10, 2004,
25 which shows they are organizing, planning. There is

1 another white sheet of paper, notebook paper with blue
2 writing on it with the schedule for the viking opening,
3 the Dragon Patrol opening, so viking is going to be a
4 patrol, a code of honor, a preparation for the Miami camp
5 out, he must have been on the PLC at that time and those
6 are his minutes from the meeting, he must have been
7 secretary then.

8 There is a PLC meeting February of 2004, team
9 volunteer program guidelines with a small, yellow insert
10 talking about something in June of some year, a teen
11 volunteer program guidelines front and back with West
12 Regional Library, no date, a merit badge, a nature merit
13 badge presented by Disney Wilderness Adventures, which
14 seems to be associated with their Disney camp out and
15 it's mostly filled in in pencil, it has a plant
16 checklist, a bug checklist, a scout field trip to the
17 post office e-mail in March of '05, lots of e-mail in
18 here, an e-mail on a post office trip from Kathy Hahn who
19 is probably a -- whose last name is Shookie,
20 S-H-O-O-K-I-E, who is probably going to be a troop adult.

21 There is one page on the troop merit badge
22 procedures on how to get one, and at that time,
23 Ms. Newman was recording completed blue cards and
24 revision dates in August of '05. There is a white sheet
25 that has kids' writing on both sides, at the top it

1 reads, "Environmental science, write report," so this
2 looks like work on the environmental science merit badge.
3 There is a notebook paper with one paragraph at the top,
4 "Hypothetical construction project, park ride areas,
5 environmental impact statement." Then there is a full
6 page of notes, "Week zero, 10/26, Hurricane Wilma has
7 passed by two days earlier," and he's talking about
8 things it looks like the effects on the plants, "Week
9 one, after hurricane leaves, must be monitoring some
10 plant growth, week two, more bugs, week three, the main
11 difference between week two and three is that the plants
12 were greener, that's all red folders connected with merit
13 badges.

14 MR. HASTY: These are loose documents.

15 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Going through loose
16 documents. At the top it reads, "Merit badge books,"
17 these are books that correspond to merit badges Mike was
18 starting but didn't complete or completed and then there
19 is a list of merit badge books, and then it says, "These
20 are books that we purchased but Mike didn't use. They
21 are older books that we had gotten for him to see if he
22 was interested in earning the corresponding merit
23 badges," and the merit badges listed are drafting,
24 entrepreneurship, sports, backpacking, orienteering,
25 music, bugling and cooking. There is a note, probably

1 from the parents, it says, "We also have Mike's 2008
2 requirements book."

3 It looks like the next thing is a duplicate
4 handout for summer camp 2003. They went to Camp
5 Woodruff, which is northeast of Atlanta, that's
6 W-O-O-D-R-U-F-F, and they would have gone in the last
7 week of June, the first week of July of 2003. Then there
8 is a summer camp 2005 list with what to bring, telling to
9 label all of their possessions which corresponds with the
10 name that is seen in his uniforms, but he doesn't have a
11 troop number in there. We can't tell the date of this
12 summer camp, other than '05, then there are several
13 copies of it.

14 There is a white sheet dated May of 2003 from
15 the assistant scout master Steve Ajzel, which is signed
16 by Michael, and it is for his merit badges that he wants
17 to take, activities of the Stone Mountain trip, the
18 Outpost Experience and Golden Skillet, which would be
19 special activities at a summer camp.

20 There is another sheet which is a schedule,
21 probably from summer camp, because it includes horseback
22 riding and a one mile swim and down at the bottom it is
23 written, "This is a typical schedule for Monday through
24 Thursday," so these are instructions to the boys for
25 summer camp. The Camp Woodruff merit badge report on

1 Michael shows he earned Indian lore, woodcarving, mammal
2 study, rifle shooting, basketry and that was dated July
3 of 2003. There is then a large folder that I'll take a
4 picture of, it's a scout folder that lists the points of
5 the scout law on the front of it, very colorful, on the
6 inside it has two items which are handouts of May 12,
7 2009. This is an important handout, it looks like a May
8 12, 2009 note to the family giving their apologies,
9 "Sincere and deepest sympathy" is what it says. Then
10 there is an individual progress report printed out from
11 the internet for Michael, dated 5/11/09, there are four
12 pages.

13 The remaining requirements as of 5/11 were
14 shown as three Eagle merit barges, emergency prep or life
15 saving, personal fitness and then swimming or cycling or
16 hiking, plus an eagle scout project, plus a scout master
17 conference, this is dated 5/11, the date of birth is
18 5/23.

19 There is a service project workbook that we
20 are going to be looking at, too, it's in a white, it's
21 roughly a one inch booklet, it has on the inside cover a
22 pocket, it has two sheets of paper in it, one is blank,
23 the other one is a rough drawing of a structure maybe or
24 a panel on a structure. He has the blank notebook form
25 that Doug Roach came up with for the hurricane districts

1 several years ago. He has his plan signed off as of
2 November of 2007 for Flamingo Gardens, the contact name
3 was Michael Ruggieri, it hasn't been authorized yet, that
4 is the plan is not signed off yet. I'm looking for
5 dates.

6 There is a development plan that is being
7 worked on. There is a site plan that is drawn up and
8 some other details that are drawn up, including a door,
9 the development plan is blank, the development sign off
10 is blank, the schedule sections are blank, the carryout
11 sections are blank. There is a section in the back
12 pocket that contains some additional work, it looks like
13 someone suggested other items he needs to add to it and
14 he's written them down, "Need to fill in the quantity of
15 items needed," there is a note here, "Other items needed,
16 Personal fitness, hiking and fitness, emergency prep."
17 Under emergency prep is written off to the right-hand
18 side, "Completing/Completed," then we have a write-up on
19 how he's going to recruit people.

20 Then there is an e-mail from October 2007 from
21 Patty Geyer copied to other people in the troop, "Mike,
22 you are off to a really good start," and then she gives
23 some suggestions on what he has to do to work on his
24 write-up. There is an August of 2008 e-mail talking
25 about some poles Mike Blew (ph) has, so this talks about

1 how to do the project in 2008 and then there are some
2 drawings with that.

3 Next is the personal health and medical
4 records, it's a class three form, it's dated 3/28/05,
5 signed by a doctor on 7/28/05, it's two pages, most of
6 the information is on the first page. Then there is a
7 personal health and medical record form class three, that
8 is dated 10/30/2002, signed by the doctor that date,
9 there are two copies of this one. On the weight section
10 there is either an asterisk or a pound sign, I guess
11 that's a pound sign, I don't see where there is an
12 asterisk talked about anywhere else.

13 There is a spiral bound five-by-eight book
14 that is boy scout requirements 2008, printing date 2008
15 and it doesn't seem to have been used. There is a card
16 from the South Florida Council, I can't tell who signed
17 it, but they are including some merit badges that Jeff
18 Hunt asked that before we -- I believe this is in
19 connection with the family asking for complete copies of
20 items to make up a scout book for Michael, and I believe,
21 make sure we see a scout book in here, because that is
22 what this form is used for and that postage was April 21,
23 2010. There is a Camp Sequoyah handout for June 11, that
24 would be a summer camp Alabama, it's a 2005 summer camp.
25 There is a --

1 MS. TIE: There were three patches in here
2 that are no longer in this envelope.

3 MR. HASTY: I opened it, there were no patches
4 in there.

5 MR. SUMMERS: They weren't in there when we --

6 MR. HASTY: It came out of that box.

7 MR. SUMMERS: Yes, it could be loose in that
8 box, that's why I'm saying as we go through.

9 MR. HASTY: I took it out of that box and
10 there are no patches in it. There are patches around.

11 MS. TIE: But that envelope, I actually know
12 for a fact --

13 MR. SUMMERS: If you will not talk, I can keep
14 doing this.

15 MS. TIE: Those three right there.

16 MR. SUMMERS: So the patches that are included
17 look to be personal fitness, hiking and emergency
18 preparedness, and I'm going to put them in here and turn
19 the card so it points down so they'll hopefully stay
20 there. Then there is some paperwork from the cub scouts.

21 The father is given a thank you for
22 participating in 2005 Pinewood Island District Derby, the
23 boy is given one for participating in the 2005 District
24 30. There is a sheet from Camp Tanah Keeta, which is the
25 camp up in the Palm Beach area, the date this was to be

1 used to go to camp I can't tell. There is another class
2 three medical dated 6/1/06 and it's stamped by Cardiology
3 Associates of West Broward, that's unlike the others.
4 Going back to the others, there is a Dr. Ron, the last
5 name starts with a B, like in Bush, who signed it and he
6 signed the '02 one, the '05 was signed by Dr. Jeffrey
7 Fliegenspan at Pediatric Associates.

8 There is a Troop 111 handbook for all scouts,
9 which looks like 20 pages, it is a welcome to Troop 111,
10 it goes back through with the last page being a behavior
11 and discipline policy, and then on the next to the last
12 page it looks like an acknowledgment, this is the second
13 revision, it was done in 1993, this revision was done in
14 2000, the second revision was done in 1993, the orange
15 one was in 1980, it was revised in 2002, the 2000
16 revision was by Nick Turnes, and then it talks about the
17 scout masters over the years, William Green, Charles
18 Walsh, James Davidson, Edwin Young, Burke Wyatt, Herbert
19 Wright, Paul Syms, Jack Tingon, Joe Sberik, Bob Johanson,
20 Peter Ollive, Bill Hague, Bob Japenski, Jon Dare, David
21 Milstein, Howard Jay and Nick Turnes, Junior. Is that
22 too much detail, Rick, to go through or not?

23 MR. HASTY: Yes.

24 MR. SUMMERS: How do you want to go through
25 the rest of this box?

1 MR. HASTY: Let's just go off the record for a
2 minute.

3 (Off the record.)

4 MR. SUMMERS: We've gone through and we've
5 just opened up the box and it contains a lot of it looks
6 like new merit badge books, I took pictures of them. I
7 looked at Personal Fitness, I'm looking at it, Personal
8 Fitness, it is a 2008 printing, it looks like it is
9 unused. The drafting merit badge does have Troop 111 on
10 it. The merit badge books on computers, again computers,
11 leather work, again leather work, graphic arts,
12 citizenship and the nation, family life, fish and
13 wildlife, electronics, soil and water, which is more
14 used, personal fitness, two draftings, entrepreneurship,
15 sportsman, cooking, backpacking, it's a 2001 printing of
16 the 2008 edition, orienteering, music and bugling. There
17 is a first aid merit badge, which looks pretty new, it's
18 a printing date of 2004, copyright dated 2002, so we seem
19 to be into actual merit badge items that were used, or at
20 least purchased by Michael, environmental science.

21 There is the boy scout requirements for 2002
22 book, it has his name written on the edge, it has some
23 blue cards in the pocket, blank blue cards and the 2008,
24 2006 requirements rather, it looks like it was used this
25 book.

1 There is also something in here on auto
2 mechanics, and then there is definitely his boy scout
3 handbook based on the vintage and the use, it has Troop
4 111 on 2/9/02, so this appears to be the real thing, and
5 the insert on the inside copy pocket is the troop
6 discipline policy, and he has a yellow sheet of paper in
7 here that looks like it's part of doing the personal
8 fitness merit badge. It looks like his initial testing
9 results, 3/21, he did one pullup, he can do 23 sit-ups,
10 he can do four pushups and he ran a quarter mile in three
11 minutes, ten seconds.

12 MR. HASTY: Okay. Now, this stuff came out of
13 where now?

14 MR. SUMMERS: That came out of this box.

15 MR. HASTY: That box?

16 MR. SUMMERS: Yes, it was on top.

17 MR. HASTY: Here, can you put all that back
18 in? This came out of that box?

19 MS. TIE: Right.

20 MR. HASTY: But they all have a red tab on
21 them.

22 MS. TIE: Okay.

23 MR. SUMMERS: There are two sheets of paper in
24 here clipped together, it's January 7, 2009, it is the
25 PLC agenda and it's mentioning the Barefoot Mailman Hike

1 is in February, it's talking about a camp out in Juniper
2 Springs and it gives the leaders for the different
3 patrols, Cobras, Batman, Gators, Evan Quinn was in charge
4 of Batman. The insert happens to be Chapter 11, Page
5 294, and that's the first aid or stop breathing section.
6 The back pages for the index of the book are coming out
7 apparently from use. This book has been used. Also, in
8 here are several patches still in the bags and never sewn
9 on, quality unit patches for 2005, 2006, 2007. Is that
10 first class?

11 MR. WINSBY: I think so.

12 MR. SUMMERS: There is a first class scout
13 badge sewn on the 111 for the troop number, never sewn
14 on. There is a life patch that wasn't used, a training
15 patch. There are two cobra patches, two Order of the
16 Arrow patches, a panda patch, a junior leader training
17 patch, which may indicate that he's been to JLT and these
18 are all unused patches still in the bag.

19 Another belt buckle, some beads, a Merit Badge
20 College name tag from some year and then quite a few
21 participatory patches, 2003 Markham Park, Disney World.
22 There is the Mike Machuk Trail patch from Tom Akita, 2002
23 Seminole Chorus, 2004 Merit Badge College, 2003 Merit
24 Badge College, a 911 patch from 2002, a Scout Master
25 Jamboree in 2005, Scout Master Jamboree in 2003, Scout

1 Shabbat in '02, Scout Master's Camp '02, New River
2 District 2001, Camp Seminole, 2002 Pine Island District,
3 Ten Commandment Hike. There is something I can't read,
4 it's a needle with a watch which matches the shirt we
5 saw, Scout Sunday patch, another Merit Badge College name
6 tag, this is from 2007, some beads and the red scout
7 shoulder patches. That finishes this. There are two big
8 banners.

9 This looks like probably patrol banners done
10 by the adults, the Bison Patrol, it gives the names of at
11 least three boys who were in it, six boys who were it.
12 The backside of it, another what looks -- this is another
13 patrol. These are the Vikings and it has eight people in
14 it and it's parent made.

15 We requested the telephone numbers, and
16 those were objected to, so I think in light of this, we
17 need to just follow up with a letter, that's the kind of
18 thing that we should be given at this point. I think
19 that's the way we move quickly with this. Ready to start
20 on the next one? I'm going to pile it out, take a
21 picture of it, talk about it.

22 MR. HASTY: Okay.

23 MR. WINSBY: I think I had one of these.

24 MR. SUMMERS: I had two. These pants are
25 unused. We're on box two of five, it looks like it's

1 mostly new clothes. We have three scout shirts that
2 never had the emblems sewn on them, they are all large.
3 We have two caps that look new, there is no grime on the
4 inside and they are still tucked in at the back. We have
5 two pair of shorts that are 38s that have never had a
6 name written on the label. We have two belts, one of the
7 belts has had a name written on it and it has a buckle on
8 it, the other belt doesn't have a buckle. We have a
9 troop handkerchief. We have two red troop T-shirts,
10 extra large, extra large, a Camp Raven blue shirt from
11 the year they went to summer camp, another one of these
12 commando camps in Alabama.

13 There is a large Sky Mont, tan T-shirt for the
14 Cherokee Area Council, which is a summer camp, it's a
15 large. We have one regular pair of socks and then two of
16 the ankle socks, scout socks, a patch from the Cherokee
17 Area Council, 2006, indicating they went to summer camp
18 then. There is a ribbon with a number of cub scout pins
19 on it, Arrow of Life, fleur-de-lis, the different wolves
20 there, and without my glasses I can't see the third
21 square patch.

22 There is an eagle scout sash, 13 rows of three
23 for 36. The last item is the telephone, it's still
24 sealed in an evidence bag. On the front it says,
25 "Evidence/Property," the agency is CCSO, the case number

1 is 09-13213, offense, death investigation, Michael is
2 identified, the date and time of recovery is nine -- the
3 date and time of recovery is 5/9/09 and 2300, recovered
4 by Eric RN, next is written "NCII," that's probably
5 Detective O'Neil, inscription, location, Samsung phone,
6 plastic bag, NCH, downtown, which is probably the Naples
7 hospital.

8 MR. HASTY: It is Naples Community Hospital.

9 MR. SUMMERS: And it looks like this is a
10 plastic evidence bag, but inside the plastic evidence bag
11 it must be that the Samsung cell phone is in a bag.

12 MR. HASTY: Which for the record was not in
13 the Rule 26 disclosure.

14 MR. SUMMERS: It's a red Samsung, T-Mobil, if
15 that helps. With no objection, we're going into box one
16 of five.

17 MR. HASTY: Now, this red notebook came out of
18 something, I don't know what it came out of.

19 MS. TIE: That came out of box two.

20 MR. HASTY: Did we do box two?

21 MR. SUMMERS: We just did that. Why don't we
22 talk about that red notebook and then I'll put it in box
23 two? Do you have a summary of what's in it? I think
24 maybe we started looking at this unofficially. This is a
25 red, three-inch binder that seems to contain items on

1 merit badges, and briefly thumbing through I see the blue
2 cards, which are important, they are in plastic folders,
3 so this is going to be a pretty good documentation of the
4 camp outs and group activities and merit badges.

5 There is a schedule from -- there is sort of a
6 ripped out section that shows some merit badges, these
7 are partial merit badges; for example, we start with
8 emergency prep on 6/17/05 and he still needs requirements
9 two, three and eight, it also discusses communications,
10 checkbox inventory sheet, some e-mails on the atmosphere,
11 a number of loose pages, personal management, auto
12 mechanics, computers, public speaking, safe exploration,
13 surveying and plumbing, it sounds like he's thinking of
14 taking them, or took them all at the same time. There is
15 a page on plants, a hike write-up, hike number three,
16 March of '05, Collier-Seminole State Park, so this would
17 be a write-up he's doing for the hiking merit badge,
18 writing up hike number three in the Everglades in 2005.
19 It says, "It's mostly mud covered water, people losing
20 their shoes, mosquitos, hot, humid, minimum plants."

21 MR. HASTY: Let's just get that copied, the
22 whole thing cover to cover.

23 MR. SUMMERS: The whole folder?

24 MR. HASTY: Yes.

25 MR. SUMMERS: Do you want anything mentioned

1 about what's in it? How do you want to do it, Rick?

2 MR. HASTY: I think you could just kind of
3 breeze through it real quick, because we're going to run
4 out of time here.

5 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Meetings set out up
6 through Thanksgiving of one year, camp outs and dates and
7 Merit Badge College. Youth leader training at Tumc, he's
8 been through some youth training it appears, or at least
9 he was scheduled for it, plants for a hike. He has a
10 hike plan in here, distance is 14.7 miles, talking about
11 sunscreen, eyeglasses, hats, socks, shoes, something on
12 public participation, probably a citizenship merit badge,
13 Old Cutler hike, December 2006, this is his write-up on
14 the Old Cutler hike, a diagram probably of an emergency
15 exit plan, something on population and community, that
16 would be for a citizenship merit badge, projects around
17 the house, taking out trash, vacuuming, that's probably
18 the family merit badge is what it looks like, feed the
19 fish, he's writing up activities for family is my guess,
20 mow the grass.

21 He has the printouts for the personal
22 management requirements. Personal management, he has to
23 come up with his income. This is his sheet for three
24 months of personal management finances, there is one
25 entry 12/28/03. There is expenses and income, he does

1 track it for about two weeks in October of '03. On
2 another sheet, family life, he tracks all of his chores,
3 family life requirements, University of Scouting packet
4 from '04, a stamp showing the Inverrary Post Office in
5 '05, March Disney camp out '04, talking about money still
6 owed, camp out planner, duty patrol projects, a coin
7 collecting merit badge, an '06 coin collecting merit
8 badge at the troop meeting, Sky Mont merit badge
9 scheduler from summer camp, daily summer camp schedule
10 from '06 and general camp information, a lot of stuff off
11 the internet from Sky Mont, a letter to Representative
12 Martinez in 2005 for the citizenship requirements,
13 environmental science and merit badge taught by Linda
14 Vedsted, Michael Rico, eagle scout project from September
15 of some year, e-mails on various activities, a list of
16 counselors for the eagle merit badges. These look like
17 troop people. This is something we want to make sure we
18 have, it looks like it's --

19 MR. HASTY: You want to mark that separately
20 here?

21 MR. SUMMERS: Five pages.

22 MR. HASTY: We can just do that now. Put that
23 in the stack.

24 MR. SUMMERS: Summer camp 2007.

25 MS. TIE: You want just that page out of that

1 binder?

2 MR. SUMMERS: That's probably four or five
3 pages.

4 MS. TIE: Well, yes.

5 MR. HASTY: We're going to want that right
6 away, whereas the other stuff, I don't know how long it's
7 going to take.

8 MR. SUMMERS: There is a February of '07 note
9 on a summer camp in North Carolina.

10 MR. HASTY: What year is that?

11 MR. SUMMERS: '07, courses for Star life and
12 Eagle Scouts is down here. This looks like a three page
13 printout from Merit Badge College. There is a Troop 111
14 leadership evaluation while he's star rank. It looks
15 like there is discussion of whether he gets credit for a
16 troop leader position, so we should have that copied, and
17 then there is attached to it one page talking about what
18 patrol leaders do.

19 Then there is a folder, then there is an
20 envelope for the scholarship merit badge and it has
21 school grades, so we're going to want a copy of this
22 envelope. Continuing through the book, Mother's Day '05,
23 then several blank pages, then a sheet called,
24 "Advancements," so these are going to contain his rank
25 advancements and his blue cards and merit badge books,

1 his merit badge cards. The rank advancements through
2 Star Scout, one page, then there are five pages of merit
3 badge cards and the last page has three on it and the
4 last ones are communications in '08, space exploration is
5 in '08 and geology in '08.

6 MR. HASTY: Why don't you start making a list
7 of what's in that pile?

8 MR. SUMMERS: He had some blue cards, which is
9 starting out with the high school counselor then was Fred
10 Martin, I don't know the date that this hiking merit
11 badge card was started, it doesn't have the counselor
12 Fred Martin's signature. These must be partials, because
13 none of these are signed, one of these is signed,
14 astronomy is signed by Mr. Quinn, hiking, architecture,
15 drafting and personal fitness, another second personal
16 fitness.

17 Fishing and wilderness survival are not
18 signed. It looks like personal fitness at Raven, again
19 somewhere else, the first time was summer camp, the next
20 time would have been in a troop atmosphere. Then the
21 next item some signed blue cards, Linda Vedsted. There
22 is a Citizenship in the Nation signed by her on three of
23 '05, personal management signed on 12 of '06, Citizenship
24 of the World isn't signed, the environmental science is
25 signed by Linda in four of '06, communications is signed

1 by Linda on five of '08, public speaking five of '07,
2 environmental science is one, communications, personal
3 management is shown as completed 1/17/07, but I don't see
4 a signature and then there is some committee member cards
5 for the parents. The father's card was good till
6 December of '08, the mother's card was good till December
7 of '08, his card was good until December of '08, there is
8 another card that was good for the mother that was good
9 till the end of January of '06.

10 The last thing in here is a hike plan for
11 hiking around Plantation, the area west of the Plantation
12 golf course, west and north of it, another one for
13 Markham Park, cycling merit badge worksheet, the first
14 two-and-a-half pages is a city commission meeting form.

15 There is a medical in here for August of '04,
16 the best I can read the doctor's name is G. Pecedy,
17 P-E-C-E-D-Y, oh, here it is, Gil Paredes, P-A-R-E-D-E-S,
18 Pediatric Associates in Weston, we want a copy of that.
19 There is one page that shows a merit badge completed in
20 '03, a Merit Badge College, a list of merit badge
21 prerequisites, all of these things are associated with
22 Merit Badge College, a printout of his history going up
23 to star, it's two pages, we'll get a copy of that, I
24 can't tell the date, 10/27/04. There is a workup for the
25 home repairs merit badge was the start of it, some more,

1 another personal progress report from '06, we'll get a
2 copy of that.

3 Trail to eagle personal fitness, it looks like
4 it's well worn. There are about eight pages estimating,
5 not counting the exercise activity log is not filled out.
6 It looks like he's gone through the classroom portion of
7 the merit badge, it gives the impression of having been
8 done in troop meetings or by the troop, I don't see a
9 date on it, it does show he took the starting test, he
10 did the one mile run in ten minutes and 43 seconds, he
11 did 38 sit-ups, he did 26 pushups, they took the
12 measurements of his body, so none of that is filled in.

13 There is another one personal fitness merit
14 badge requirements, it's in better shape, it looks like
15 it's unused, it says, "Period one," so it looks like it
16 went -- it looks like it was associated with the Merit
17 Badge College, nothing in here is filled out, so I will
18 not make a copy of it, it's blank. I'm going to write on
19 the very top of this, which is the top document, it's
20 personal fitness, I'm going to write "Red book" to show
21 where it came from.

22 MR. HASTY: I don't think this was opened
23 here.

24 MR. SUMMERS: This goes in box two.

25 MR. HASTY: I'm going through what appears to

1 be a bag of sympathy cards, there is another bag in
2 there. We need to go ahead and catalog whatever else is
3 in there. We're going to want this copied. That's the
4 funeral service at the temple.

5 MR. SUMMERS: I'll take a picture of it right
6 here. We are on box one which is the last box. There
7 are some merit badge books, camping, with the word "1999"
8 written in the upper right. On the insert it says,
9 "Property of Troop 111," and the revision is 1997,
10 printing date 1999. There is an archaeology book which
11 is the '97 version, the '97 revision. There is a first
12 aid book, it looks pretty well worn, it has a stamp on it
13 it says, "Property of Troop 111, Plantation United
14 Methodist Church," it has a stamp of the troop on the
15 inside cover, "ENF" is written in there, the date it was
16 copyrighted is 1998 and it doesn't have a separate
17 printing date.

18 There is a youth leadership certificate, so he
19 did go to JLT and that's the -- or YLT rather, September
20 of '08. There is a plastic bag containing the book on
21 knots, three pens and some folded up blank white paper.
22 The book, "Knots and how to tie them," it's copyrighted
23 1978, it looks unused. There are shirts again, the red
24 Troop 111 shirt, "Where Eagles Sore," it's an XL, it
25 looks like it might not have been worn. There is a Troop

1 III dark black, or I guess this one is black, it's an XL,
2 it might have been washed. There is a ribbon for South
3 Florida Council 45th, Scout Master's Camporee, this is a
4 patrol flag, third place, this would be something
5 belonging to the troop. There is a pin given in support
6 of a donation to The South Florida Council, it looks like
7 it's still in the box, the funeral handout, I'm looking
8 for a date on it.

9 MR. HASTY: That came out of the packet of
10 condolence cards or sympathy cards, that's where that
11 came from.

12 MR. SUMMERS: The date is May 12th, 2009, I'll
13 take a copy of that. There is a Flamingo Gardens walking
14 map handout. Does anybody know where Flamingo Gardens
15 is?

16 MS. TIE: It's on Flamingo and almost by
17 Griffin.

18 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. There is a name card for
19 the Merit Badge College in 2008 and something in one of
20 the pockets. There is something that cinches the cord, a
21 lot of patches, there is a Sky Mont chaplain's aide, a
22 patrol leader's patch, none of these have been used by
23 the way, a Mission Possible 2007, Friends of Scouting,
24 Congregational Church, Old Cutler Hike from 2006 patch,
25 aquatics, environmental 2008, Scout Master's Jamboree,

1 2006 Friends of Scouting patch, a Merit Badge College
2 15th anniversary patch, it looks like it's the tenth year
3 Scout Master's Camporee patch, maybe 2007, a troop guide
4 patch that has never been used, a scout Sunday patch, a
5 Sky Mont reservation 2006 patch. There is a code of
6 honor from March 25, 2009 handout, at least six pages. I
7 see the scout master's comments is done by Howard
8 Crompton.

9 MR. HASTY: Let's make a separate copy of
10 that.

11 MR. SUMMERS: This we need a copy of. The
12 Life to Eagle advisors are Doug Beals, who is listed as
13 trained and Patty Geyer, health and safety is Rosemarie
14 Novak, the assistant scout master's first assistant is
15 Chris Zimmerman, the first year scout advisor is Bradley
16 Schmidt, the Batman patrol advisor is Larry Abrams, the
17 Cobra advisor is Doug Beals, the quartermaster is Jim
18 Rice, the senior patrol leader is Nikh Mohip, the
19 assistant patrol leader is Sam Kent.

20 MR. HASTY: Let's get a copy of that.

21 MR. SUMMERS: There is a schedule here. Then
22 there is a May 28, '08 code of honor, the same type of
23 thing, this one has also I guess it's stapled together,
24 please be careful with that. There is an envelope to
25 Michael and the family, the Eagle Code of Honor for

1 Bradley Schmidt, dinner following ceremony, so it's an
2 invitation. Then there is a program for Brad Schmidt's
3 Eagle ceremony, we'll make a copy of that and there is a
4 program for November of '08 for Andrew Novak, we'll make
5 a copy of that.

6 Then it looks like there is a bound document
7 with printouts dated in May 2009 that appears to be
8 Facebook type entries after the death, so we want a copy
9 of that, it also includes some newspaper articles, then
10 there is a packet of documents here, one written, two
11 pages after the death about three weeks ago, I assume
12 that means high school, and not signed by anyone, troop
13 committee minutes of August of '08, some other troop
14 agendas and then the Troop 111 Life to Eagles as of April
15 of '08. I think we should just copy all of this.

16 MR. HASTY: Yes, just do it. Instead of
17 putting it on the record --

18 MR. SUMMERS: This is a pack about an inch or
19 more thick, it contains the Life to Eagle records and
20 some different programs for activities the troop is
21 doing. There is a parent permission form for 2007 and
22 2008. Let me back up.

23 There is a medical form and health insurance
24 form. This one is a May '08 version and then there is
25 the parent permission form for '07, '08. Then there is

1 the class three medical science signed 5/17/08. There is
2 a class three medical form, this one is dated 5/17/08 and
3 it's signed by the pediatrician we've seen before.

4 MR. HASTY: Let's put that in the stack over
5 there.

6 MR. SUMMERS: This one I think we've seen,
7 because that's the one at the time of the hike. In the
8 original packet, it came right after the '07, '08 parent
9 permission form. The next document now is the financial
10 report on the troop in April much '08.

11 MR. HASTY: And we're going to get these three
12 slips or one card and two letters copied from the
13 sympathy stack.

14 MR. SUMMERS: Then there is a merit badge
15 counselor information on different merit badge
16 counselors, Howard Adelman is listed, the mother is
17 listed as a merit draft counselor in drafting, art and
18 landscape architecture, then there is what we've seen
19 before the Troop 111 merit badge procedures, then there
20 is a one page write-up that appears to be in Michael's
21 handwriting, "The Benefits of Scouting," then there are
22 some miscellaneous pages, it might have been the Buffalo
23 Patrol, some checkoffs of some different first names, it
24 looks like stuff they are going to bring to different
25 camp outs, also Viking, so he must have been a Viking

1 patrol, he's a patrol with Collin, Nicole, Kim, maybe
2 Kris with a K and Sam.

3 There is a volunteer leader application that
4 is not filled out, merit badge counselor information,
5 apparently counselors within the troop, the father is
6 listed as graphic arts, home repairs, fish and wildlife
7 management. Under, "Graphic arts," it says he's been in
8 the printing business for 20 years, Doug Beals is the
9 counselor for emergency preparedness, fireman-ship,
10 hiking -- the list is skills stemming from being a fire
11 fighter, EMT and in the Marine Corp, Drew Novak's Eagle
12 project is here for February of some year, it looks like
13 a map for a hike.

14 There is a November of 2006 one page calendar
15 and on the back are notes about Peace River, it must have
16 been the Peace River camp out, the agenda from 10 of '06,
17 architectural merit badge requirements. Then there is an
18 individual progress to Michael at age 15, PLC November of
19 '06, Patrol Grub Master Planning Guide, PLC from May '06,
20 rules for camp out procedures, he was in biking patrol at
21 that point, then some information on patrol emblems, PLC
22 of April of '06, then there are emergency and hurricane
23 plans, PLC 9/06, then a map for Oleta River State Park, a
24 blank PLC meeting form, then a February of '06 Big
25 Cypress camp out form. He did wilderness survival

1 requirements, as well as other activities.

2 MR. HASTY: Let's get those.

3 MR. SUMMERS: PLC February of '06.

4 MR. HASTY: Let's put those in the immediate
5 copy area.

6 MR. SUMMERS: These aren't that exciting.

7 MR. HASTY: All right. Okay.

8 MR. SUMMERS: Scout Master Camporee '04, Scout
9 Master Camporee February of '06, with schedules
10 associated with that next down, so I assume they go
11 together, PLC, February of '07.

12 There is a Pine Island District on-line
13 training options printout that is undated, it shows you
14 protection, safe swim, safety -- boy scout leader, first
15 troop committee challenge and then it has duties as a
16 patrol leader, then what the troop guide duties are, the
17 National Youth Leadership training, an Eagle Claw
18 participation form that's not filled out, camp out duty
19 roster that's not filled out, a PLC agenda January of
20 '07, a membership evaluation form which isn't signed, but
21 it is filled out, it looks like filled out by Michael, he
22 was in the Viking/Bison.

23 Then there is a Nova High School National
24 Honor Society, summer of '07 form, and it shows the
25 people who were officers, Kim Jones, Joyce Wang, last

1 name -- the first name of the treasurer is Nandini, last
2 name is Brina, the secretary was Libby Hunt, then Eve
3 Colebrett, Sara Gibson. I don't see Michael's name on
4 here, National Honor Society, membership application '06,
5 '07, he filled this out in tenth grade. His grade point
6 average was 3.2857 and the requirement was that you have
7 a 30 grade point. He's sponsored by AO Connor or A
8 O'Connor in the science department and then there is a
9 write-up from Schmidt of 3/7/07, which sounds like a
10 recommendation letter, talking about Michael
11 demonstrating leadership in his patrol by creating a
12 patrol flag and flag pole, so we'll get a copy of that
13 quickly.

14 Then there is a folder Bison flag and it has a
15 layout of the Bison flag, which we've seen. Then there
16 is some drawing of something six-foot high, my guess best
17 I can do holding the flag up. Then there are directions
18 to somewhere on maybe Key Largo. There is an e-mail from
19 6/06 from Doug to Howard on the aviation merit badge, I
20 believe that would be Doug Beals, I assume.

21 Then there is a 6/06 e-mail from Chris
22 Zimmerman to someone named Kris, Chris Zimmerman is an
23 architect, they are talking about community healthcare
24 and shotgun merit badges and it looks like everything
25 just started, Chris Roberts and also Patty Geyer is

1 involved, Chris is not -- let's see, Patty is not going
2 to summer camp in '06. Chris is saying he's not going to
3 summer camp in '06, he wants to do some merit badges.

4 Then there is a brown folder that contains two
5 pages, it looks like a write-up after his death, it is
6 from Christopher Patrick Geyer-Roberts and we'll just get
7 a copy of this upfront. I'll put these in the box. This
8 book that says, "Michael," it looks like a subscribed
9 book.

10 MR. HASTY: We're going to want to get copies
11 of these photos, just these, not all of them, there are a
12 bunch. How do you want me to do this? Take these out
13 how? There are four photos that I want.

14 MS. TIE: I know.

15 MR. SUMMERS: This notebook has I'll guess
16 eight pages, the first three are written on, the first
17 one is full, the second one is two-thirds full, the third
18 one is half of two-thirds full. I assume this is after
19 his death, it's not entirely clear; yes, it's after his
20 death. There is an entry by Vedsted, "With humor and
21 wit, your smiling face will sorely be missed. With all
22 my love, Ms. Vedsted." There is a plastic bag with some
23 very basic printouts from 3/30/07 on the internet on
24 second class scout and first class merit badges, all of
25 these are the same date.

1 There is an e-mail from Michael 7/22/06, a
2 letter to The New York Times, my guess this is associated
3 with the citizenship merit badge. He's writing a letter
4 about re-drawing political lines. There is an estimate
5 in here on a piece of paper on camp spending, then there
6 is a one page communications requirements and it's a
7 sales plan, it looks like it's work on a merit badge,
8 then there is a personal management write-up and it is
9 filled in, it starts in 6/12 with an allowance and money
10 spent and the balance, it looks like he ends up with zero
11 money near the end, but he goes through September 13th
12 and that will be for the personal management
13 requirements. Then there is a blue something, maybe Rick
14 knows what this is. Rick tells me it's a cooking apron,
15 I'm not sure what it's associated with, but something
16 with scouting. Then there is a packet of correspondence,
17 the top one is May 14, 2009, so you assume these are
18 condolence letters.

19 MR. HASTY: I've been through all of them.

20 MR. SUMMERS: Do you want copies of these?

21 MR. HASTY: No, I cherry-picked what I want
22 out of there. I'm dealing with the second envelope now.

23 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. There is something here
24 that looks like a mini Bible, perpetual membership in
25 the --

1 MR. HASTY: It's a mass dedication.

2 MR. SUMMERS: Being Catholic, I didn't know
3 what it was, Union City, New Jersey, it's May 9 of '09.
4 What is Hattiesburg forensics, do you know?

5 MR. HASTY: Hattiesburg, Mississippi, it's a
6 kid on the debate team met him and sent a sympathy card
7 when he learned about his death. This stack is probably
8 five inches tall. Off the record.

9 (Off the record.)

10 THE COURT REPORTER: Are you ordering the
11 transcript?

12 MR. HASTY: Yes.

13 THE COURT REPORTER: Do you need a copy of the
14 transcript?

15 MR. SUMMERS: Yes.

16 THE COURT REPORTER: Do you need a copy of the
17 transcript?

18 MR. WINSBY: Yes.

19 (Thereupon, the proceedings were concluded at
20 1:15 p.m.)
