1 MR. HASTY: Okay. We are here November 24th 2 to conduct the inspection of documents in the matter of 3 Howard Adelman and Judith Sclawy, as co-personal 4 representatives of the estate of Michael Sclawy Adelman, 5 case number 10-CV-22236-ASG. And present as defense б counsel are? 7 MR. SUMMERS: Bill Summers on behalf of the 8 Boy Scouts. 9 MR. WINSBY: Joseph Winsby on behalf of the 10 Plantation United Methodist Church. 11 MR. HASTY: And my name is Frederick Hasty on 12 behalf of Howard Crompton and Andrew Schmidt, the 13 defendants. 14 So, we're going to look at the production of 15 documents pursuant to Federal Rule 26 from the 16 plaintiffs, and we're going to identify what is here as 17 best we can. If we have questions, we will then pose 18 them to the plaintiff's counsel, who are not present in 19 the room, but have a representative law clerk present. 20 MR. SUMMERS: I'll start with, there are boxes 21 one through five the way they are labeled and there seems 22 to be about five of the large boxes that contains the 23 backpack, a Camel backpack. 24 Looking in the compartments, starting with the 25 back going forward, the first compartment has a towel and

1 it has a Quaker chewy. 2 MR. HASTY: Get the flavor there, because 3 there are several. 4 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Honey nut. Then in the 5 main compartment, I pulled out a Camel back water pack, б which is used as a hose to drink from, I don't see the 7 size on it. 8 MR. HASTY: It doesn't matter. 9 MR. SUMMERS: It's at least a quart, it's 10 pretty standard issue backpack. There is an orange 11 pouch, let's see what's in it, inside the pouch are a 12 pair of socks that haven't been used. 13 MR. HASTY: Boy Scout socks. 14 MR. SUMMERS: Boy Scout socks. There is what 15 looks like a bandage, a towelette, it's in a plastic bag, 16 it's toilet paper, about a one-inch roll. Then there is 17 a Trek One first aid kit, brand name Coghlan's. Do you 18 want to list the contents? 19 MR. HASTY: Yes. 20 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. It looks like a pretty 21 standard hiking -- it has three dry wipes, which look 22 like they are probably dried out, but not open. It's got 23 six large Band-Aids, it has five -- six large Band-Aids, 24 two small Band-Aids and I guess these are the things put 25 on your nose to breathe that you see the football players

1 with them. It has something about a one-by-two inch 2 strip that I probably would call mole skin, also used for 3 There is a piece from the back of a Band-Aid, hiking. 4 which shows that there must have been a Band-Aid used at 5 some point, do you see this? б MR. HASTY: Yes. 7 MR. SUMMERS: I'm showing that. We have a roll of tape, I can't tell if it is gauze, but it is 8 9 probably adhesive tape. There is an Instant Guide to First Aid here, I'll come back to that. There is also 10 11 several additional items of mole skin, it looks like they 12 are three-by-four inches, there are three of those, and 13 there is a partial piece which is about two inches by two 14 inches, it has been cut from a larger piece at one time. 15 There is a larger Band-Aid. There is a gauze pad, a 16 three-by-three gauze pad, it looks like there are four of 17 those. 18 The Instant Guide to First Aid has a needle in 19 it it pulls out. You might want to get a copy of this, 20 Rick? The thing is covered here, it covers guite a bit, 21 including heat exhaustion, heart attack and heat stroke. 22 MR. HASTY: Just read what --23 MR. SUMMERS: "Heat exhaustion," I'm going to 24 go with heart attack, too. "Heart attack, pain in the 25 chest, three columns, "Injury, symptoms and treatment,

heart attack, pain in the chest, shoulders, lower jaw, 1 2 upper arm, complaints of heartburn or indigestion, 3 blue/gray pallor, sweating, apprehension, distress, 4 denial. The treatment is arrange for transportation or 5 seek medical assistance -- sit in a position of comfort, 6 usually semi-sitting, monitor vital signs, be prepared to 7 assist with CPR." Next with, "Heat exhaustion, cool, clammy 8 9 skin, weak, rapid pulse, rapid, shallow breathing. The 10 treatment, move to a cooler area if possible, remove 11 extra clothing, treat for shock. Recovery should follow 12 a short rest, otherwise seek medical care." 13 Heat stroke is the third item, "Rapid onset, 14 hot, dry, flushed skin, initial, rapid pulse, decreasing 15 progressively, twitching, convulsions. The treatment is 16 quickly cool the person, remove clothing, fan, wrap in a 17 sheet and sprinkle with water, stabilize and monitor vitals, transport." 18 19 I'm going to read stroke, because one of them 20 referred to stroke. Under stroke, the second column 21 reads, "Inability to speak, one side of the face appears 22 flaccid or sagging, one pupil larger than the other, slow 23 pulse, one-sided paralysis. Treatment, transport, 24 medical aid in a position of comfort, often semi-prone or 25 semi-sitting, monitor vitals and assist with AR or CPR,"

I think we should probably get a copy of this. 1 2 MR. HASTY: Yes. In the backpack, there was 3 also this, put on the record, there are four peanut 4 Nature Valley bars, two packs of Orbit gum containing 14 5 pieces in each which are mint, five Nature Valley oat and б honey bars, a container of Neutrogena Ultra Sheer Body 7 Mist Sunblock, SPF 70, Neutrogena Ultra Sheer Dry Touch Sunblock, lightweight, clean ointment, SPF 70, a National 8 9 Parks Systems map and quide which has the Big Cypress, 10 it's an actual map. On the back there are -- there is 11 information about the national park system guide. 12 MR. SUMMERS: I'm putting everything back in 13 the orange bag. I also note that there are some either 14 peanuts or flakes from it looks like one of the power 15 bars. 16 MR. HASTY: Did you go in this section here? 17 MR. SUMMERS: No. 18 This is more tubing, another pack. MR. HASTY: 19 MR. SUMMERS: What we found as part of the 20 Camel backpack, it contains it's own water bladder, so 21 there is a water bladder inside the backpack and then 22 there is a separate water bottle, Camel back that's 23 actually separate from the back, it probably can be 24 strapped on the back of the pack. 25 MR. HASTY: Does it say --

1	MR. WINSBY: This is a Camel bladder that we
2	found within the smaller compartment of the backpack and
3	it reads, "80 ounces."
4	MR. SUMMERS: That has you see it?
5	MR. HASTY: It's own bottle.
6	MR. SUMMERS: It's the same basic
7	MR. HASTY: It says "100" here, that's 100
8	ounces. That takes care of that pack.
9	MR. SUMMERS: Did you check this side?
10	MR. HASTY: I did not.
11	MR. SUMMERS: Okay. In the side pocket on the
12	right-hand side there is an oats honey wrapper. The
13	other side pocket on the left-hand side is empty. There
14	is a capital "M" written inside the back of the backpack.
15	MR. HASTY: In this box we have two
16	certificates of appreciation to Howard Adelman, one is
17	dated September 10th, 2008, one is dated September 27th,
18	2006. In 2006, it says, "For dedication and service for
19	Scouts Troop 111 as a 2006 summer camp leader, Sky Mont
20	Reservation, Altamonte, Tennessee," and that's the one
21	dated September 27th, signed by Andy Schmidt as the scout
22	master and Linda Vedsted as committee chair. Then the
23	other certificate is to Howard Adelman, "In
24	appreciation," dated September 10th, 2008 for summer camp
25	adult leader, Camp Raven Knob, Mont Airy, North Carolina

1 and this is, again, signed by Andy Schmidt and Howard 2 Crompton, committee chair. Just take a picture there. 3 There is also a certificate or a plaque to 4 Howard Adelman and that is dated September 28, 2005 for 5 being an adult leader, summer camp at Camp Sequoyah, б Delta, Alabama in September 28, 2005, signed by Andy 7 Schmidt, scout master, and Linda Vedsted, committee chair. You got that, right? 8 9 MR. SUMMERS: Yes. 10 MR. HASTY: There is a troop name badge. 11 MR. SUMMERS: For both parents. 12 MR. HASTY: And then from the same box are 13 some badges. 14 MR. SUMMERS: These are position bangs. 15 MR. HASTY: Yes. 16 MR. SUMMERS: These are advancement badges and 17 it looks like this is a beaver patrol badge, patrol 18 leader badge, assistant patrol leader badge, quality unit 19 2000 badge, South Florida Council 2003 arm patch. This 20 is one of the -- what is that? It's a round patch with a 21 red arrow on it and then it has the ranks up through 22 first class. 23 Take a picture of that. MR. HASTY: Then we 24 have "The Boy Scout Handbook, A Guide to Adventure, A 25 Guidebook for Life." This book is --

1	MR. SUMMERS: It looks like it's untouched.
2	This may be a very new one.
3	MR. HASTY: Yes, I was looking for the date.
4	MR. SUMMERS: I can find that probably. It
5	goes beyond this. The parent's guide is still in there.
6	MR. HASTY: It's the 12th Edition.
7	MR. SUMMERS: It's the 12th Edition, copyright
8	2009, so we're looking at something published in the year
9	2009 or 2010, it has a cover with an eagle and at the top
10	there are some kids on a raft. Based on the way it looks
11	on the edges, I don't think it has ever really been
12	opened up.
13	MR. HASTY: And we have the merit badge series
14	for hiking, Boy Scouts of America. Let's see if we can
15	find a date.
16	MR. SUMMERS: It might have been used, but
17	it's not marked. It's a 2009 printing. Take a picture
18	of that. There is a field book here, fourth edition,
19	copyright 2004, it shows Roy Williams as the chief scout
20	executive, it doesn't seem to have had much use. Then
21	there are some merit badge books on emergency
22	preparedness, camping, first aid and personal fitness.
23	MR. HASTY: Let's get the dates.
24	MR. SUMMERS: Personal fitness has no marks in
25	it, it doesn't appear to have much, if any, use, it's the

2010 printing of the 2009 revision. The first aid merit 1 2 badge is 2010 printing of the 2007 copyright. All of 3 these appear to be very recent and unused. The camping 4 merit badge book is the 2010 printing of the 2005 5 copyright. The emergency preparedness merit badge is the б 2008 printing of the 2008 copyright. 7 MR. HASTY: Those clothes, was he wearing those clothes? Are those his clothes that he owned? 8 9 MS. TIE: I am not sure. 10 MR. SUMMERS: None of these merit badges seem 11 to show much, if any, use. There are actually six boxes, 12 aren't they? One is a priority mailbox. 13 MS. TIE: Actually, those are separate out of 14 those boxes. 15 MR. SUMMERS: Which one? The big one? 16 MS. TIE: The books are not in that. 17 MR. HASTY: They were kept separate. 18 MR. SUMMERS: So in the number six box, that 19 was the certificates, the cloth patches, the name tag and 20 the plaque. 21 MR. HASTY: Two certificates, one plaque. 22 This was a separate pile. 23 MR. SUMMERS: So there are six boxes and three 24 piles and three tubes. 25 MR. HASTY: What box number is that?

1	MR. WINSBY: This is box number four of five.
2	MR. HASTY: Four of five. These appear to be
3	clothes.
4	MR. SUMMERS: These are class Bs and class A
5	uniform, one for the troop, Troop 111. Let's just see.
6	The dark brown and black, it's a large. There is a Merit
7	Badge College white T-shirt, large, I don't see a year on
8	that. There is a pair of classic scout shorts.
9	MR. HASTY: Another troop T-shirt.
10	MR. SUMMERS: The same size?
11	MR. HASTY: It's a large.
12	MR. SUMMERS: Okay. We'll take a picture of
13	that. The next T-shirt is "Opportunity is now," anything
14	on the back of that one?
15	MR. HASTY: No, it's a large. Let's go off
16	the record for a minute.
17	(Off the record.)
18	MR. SUMMERS: Another T-shirt, "The ultimate
19	Summer Camp Experience, Survivor Camp," I don't know what
20	that is. Where do the words start and stop? "Camp Comer
21	Camp Sequoyah, Greater Alabama Council."
22	MR. HASTY: I think it's camp Comer Camp
23	Sequoyah, Great Alabama Council.
24	MR. SUMMERS: Okay. Hold that up for us.
25	There is a troop cap. There are some arm braids which

1 were probably for a troop guide. There is a Boy Scout 2 shirt, it's a mens' large, it shows a scribe, it has a 3 "Trained patch," which you normally see on adults, it has 4 a Life Scout emblem on the left front pocket and it has 5 the patch from the Scout Master's Camp 30th anniversary 6 in 2009. Take a picture of that. 7 MR. HASTY: Markham Park, Sunrise, Florida and 8 this is the scout master's camporee. 9 MR. SUMMERS: There is a pair of long pants, 10 scout pants, it has a minor's name written in them, 11 Michael's name written in there, a size 36 waist and they 12 are rolled up at the bottom about three inches. 13 MR. HASTY: Shorts, socks, T-shirts. 14 There is another pair of long MR. SUMMERS: 15 pants, size 38. When I say size 38, waist 38, a scruffy, 16 torn up T-shirt. It looks like this was probably what he 17 was wearing is my guess, it's been cut down the front. 18 MR. HASTY: That's the one he was using the 19 day he died? 20 MR. SUMMERS: Yes. This says, "United States 21 of America" on the front of it and on the patch it has 22 the troop identified, another pair of shorts, these are 23 size 38s, a scout belt with a buckle, another T-shirt, 24 this one has some paint on it, it's a Troop 111 T-shirt, 25 this one is dark green, another troop T-shirt 111 with

1 the label cut out, it looks like it's in pretty good 2 shape, another pair of shorts, these are size 38s, then 3 there are several pairs of socks. There are four of the 4 low-rise socks and it looks like seven-and-a-half pairs 5 of the high socks, not the very highest but the б mid-socks. Continuing with box four which contains 7 clothes. 8 MR. HASTY: You guys can do these. 9 MR. SUMMERS: Looking at the tubes --10 MR. HASTY: There are three of them. 11 MR. WINSBY: They are differentiated from the 12 outside. 13 MR. SUMMERS: I opened one, it has a red 14 banner in it, it says, "Forever in our heart," and one of 15 them says, "Never forgotten, RIP, Michael," signed, 16 "Love, Molly," so this looks like this is after-the-fact. 17 This is a banner that is 10 or 15 feet long, maybe 18 longer, and it looks like maybe ten or so people signed 19 it, Sharon signed it, Moki signed it, Sara signed it, 20 Briana signed it, Laurel signed it, Chandler, Molly, Alex 21 Abreu, Courtney C., Natasha Logan, I'll try and read 22 this, T-A-T-I-A-N-N-A, last name, B-L-O-T, Amber, Sara 23 The next one, you have a more challenging Davis. 24 assignment than I have. 25 MR. WINSBY: I removed a large, brown paper

1 scroll from one of the white tubes, it contains a banner 2 that reads in part, "RIP." The banner in its entirety 3 reads, "From all at Nova High School, RIP, Michael 4 Sclawy," and there are many notes, apparently from the 5 students at Nova High School to Michael. б MR. HASTY: Why don't we start a pile then? 7 MS. TIE: Okay. I'm looking at a notebook that 8 MR. HASTY: 9 says, "The Michael Sclawy Adelman memory album," we're 10 going to want this whole document copied. There are a 11 lot of letters in here. 12 MR. SUMMERS: So you now in the three tubes, 13 we have the one red cloth banner with a little bit 14 written on it, we have one brown paper banner with a lot 15 written on it and then we have the third one, which is 16 another brown paper banner, and it has a medium amount 17 written on it. The first paper banner was full, this one 18 is I would say about half full. Rick, we will not finish 19 by noon. 20 MR. HASTY: No, I don't think so. 21 MR. SUMMERS: There are three boxes that we 22 haven't gone into. 23 MR. HASTY: Wait. Hold on. I'm almost done. 24 I have been going through the memory album and there is a 25 letter from Christine Chambers, is it Chambers or

1 Chombers? I think it's Chombers, C-H-O-M-B-E-R-S, and 2 then there is a letter from his sister, Elizabeth, which 3 are not actually in the three-ring binder, they are in 4 the folder or the slat of the three-ring binder, so we're 5 going to want to get those copied. I'm almost done here. 6 I'm going to want copies of that. 7 MR. SUMMERS: Right. I'm done with this. 8 MR. HASTY: I'd like to 9 get these today. The rest of these I could get next week 10 and the memory album, but this I would like to get today. 11 MR. SUMMERS: Let me take a picture of the 12 memory album. 13 MR. HASTY: It didn't flash. 14 MR. SUMMERS: No, it did not. As far as 15 these, we are looking at several scout publications, 16 there is The Health and Safety Guide, it looks new, it's 17 the 2006 printing. 18 The Passport to High Adventure. MR. HASTY: 19 MR. SUMMERS: 2008, it looks unused. 20 MR. HASTY: Scout master, assistant scout 21 master, leader, specific training. 22 MR. SUMMERS: He mentioned there is a CD ROM 23 enclosed, this is a 2010 printing, and it doesn't look 24 like it has been touched. There is a CD ROM in the back. 25 MR. HASTY: Is that the whole book on the ROM?

Third edition? 1 2 MR. SUMMERS: Very likely the --3 MR. HASTY: I wonder if they could run that 4 right now, can you do that? 5 I'm sorry? MS. TIE: б MR. SUMMERS: There is a CD here, can you copy 7 it? 8 I will check with the IT people. MS. TIE: 9 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. So we're talking about 10 the scout master, assistant scout master, leader 11 training, so we'll try to get a copy of the CD ROM in the 12 back so we can walk out with that. 13 MR. HASTY: We'll just wait a minute, because 14 if that could be done, we may not have to copy it. This 15 has never been taken out? 16 MS. TIE: No. 17 MR. HASTY: So I'd have to break the seal, I'm 18 going to let you do that. Here, why don't you do that? 19 Either you could make a hard copy or if they can make a 20 copy of the CD ROM? I'm not going to break the seal. 21 You all decide how you want to handle it, it's your 22 property. We'll just go off the record for a minute. 23 (Off the record.) 24 MR. SUMMERS: Okay. We'll continue. 25 MR. HASTY: We could use a professional copy

1 service if that's what you want to do? 2 MS. TIE: Well, I mean, I don't know what the 3 total copying is going to be, so it would be kind of 4 better if you guys want to put together an entire pile of 5 things so we can decide if a professional copy service б would be easier, better, if all you want is a couple of 7 pages. MR. HASTY: It's going to be a lot. 8 9 MR. SUMMERS: You don't want to do it 10 in-house? 11 MR. HASTY: The other issue is we have a time 12 constraint, the parents' depositions are coming up. 13 MS. TIE: Right. 14 The document we're looking at MR. SUMMERS: 15 now is, "Troop Program Features, Volume II," it is the 16 2007 printing. Then there is the Scout Master Handbook, 17 which is a white notebook, it is the 2009 printing. None 18 of these books appear to have been used. There is "The 19 Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills," which is the 20 2010 printing, with a copyright of 2000. There is "The 21 Troop Committee Guidebook," which is the 2008 printing of 22 the 1998 copyright, then there are quite a few internet, 23 well, maybe not. The first item on top is an internet 24 printout of two pages, "Sweet 16 VSA Safety," the website 25 is scouting.org/scoutsource/heathandsafety/sweet16, and

that was dated November 24th, 2010, so I guess that was 1 2 this morning. Then there is Treck Safety which has a 3 2003 copyright and this was copied out of a book. You 4 can see where the staple marks are in the upper left, 5 there are three pages, Seven Points of Treck Safety 6 Program, then there is a guide to safe scouting. 7 MS. TIE: That's the whole pile? MR. SUMMERS: Yes. It probably was printed 8 9 off of the internet in color, it is a 2007 printing of 10 the 1998 copyright and this one has a total of 68 pages, 11 plus unnumbered pages that at the top say, "Notes," but 12 otherwise the page is blank, there are three of those. 13 Then there is one page, "Scouting Dollars." The next is, 14 "Support Scouting BSA Risk Ready," and the last page 15 is -- this contains the universal code and the Boy Scout 16 emblem and dress, so it's a guide to safe scouting of 17 some publication. Did we get the date on the scout 18 master handbook? Just to make sure, it is the 2009 19 printing. You have this notebook in front of you, and 20 the pages you talk about, how do you want to handle that? 21 MR. HASTY: I just need to get a copy. 22 MR. SUMMERS: The memory album? 23 MR. HASTY: Yes. There is a letter from 24 Elizabeth, his sister, and another young lady, with a 25 handwritten note, which is not a part of the three-ring

1 binder. 2 MR. SUMMERS: The one from Christine Chambers, 3 it's a full page --4 MR. HASTY: I think it's Chombers. 5 MR. SUMMERS: Chombers, plus five lines on the 6 back of it, "PS," and the other one seems to be a 7 photocopy of a three page letter. I'll take a picture of Those three boxes, we haven't opened any of that, 8 that. 9 they are largely filled with paper. 10 MR. HASTY: This one is box number, it's 11 labeled three and five. 12 MR. SUMMERS: Why don't I say what they are? 13 What you are looking at this first page, that's probably 14 from first aid. Identifying poisonous plants, Page 318 15 is probably a reference to The Boy Scout Handbook, he's 16 identifying ivy, sumak, poison oak, which is a poisonous 17 plant and he identifies the different pages I believe 18 from the reference to the Boy Scout Handbook, how to 19 treat these problems. 20 We have printouts showing his schedule, 21 probably at Merit Badge College, it's on Saturday morning 22 and Saturday afternoon, so I'm 99 percent sure it's Merit 23 Badge College. 24 MR. WINSBY: All these documents are coming 25 from a red hanging folder.

1 MR. SUMMERS: Yes. We've got a family tree 2 that may be from a genealogy, a merit badge, then we have 3 some color pictures probably of their house, but it's of 4 the foliage around it. We have a printout. We have a 5 copy of the Family Life Requirement and then the б prerequisites. There is a blank page and the different 7 schedules. It looks like a second time he has gone to 8 Merit Badge College, this time with nature study and 9 genealogy, so that matches what we've just seen, it has 10 the requirements on reading merit badge, the requirements 11 on leather works. Rick, do you want me to record what 12 these are or just get a copy of them? 13 MR. HASTY: What is the word on the CD? 14 MS. TIE: I got ahold of Mark and I will go 15 ahead and make a copy of the letter from Elizabeth, that 16 I can give to you guys today, but as far as everything 17 else goes, if you guys want to put together a list of 18 everything you want copied because, obviously, it is 19 going to be a massive amount of paper and miscellaneous 20 items, that we're going to have to use a copy service to 21 take care of that? So if you guys just want to keep a 22 running tab of what you want? 23 I think we're going to stack MR. SUMMERS: 24 them at the end of the table. 25 MR. HASTY: Well, we need to identify it, make

1	sure we get it, that's the problem.
2	MR. SUMMERS: Then I'll read through it.
3	MR. HASTY: Yes.
4	MR. SUMMERS: Continuing through the red
5	hanging folder, it's the list of things to do before
6	Scout Masters, probably a reference to the scout master's
7	camp out and he has service project and Riverside
8	Regional.
9	MR. HASTY: She says start stacking what we
10	want copied.
11	MR. SUMMERS: Do you want a copy of this?
12	MR. HASTY: I do.
13	MR. SUMMERS: Inside the red hanging folder is
14	a blue folder with his name on the front. There is a
15	loose sheet in here that is identifying plants,
