Re: Faye and David Lasky

Dear Sir or Madam:

Pursuant to the ticket that was issued to my clients, Faye Lasky and her deceased husband, David Lasky, I am writing to put you on notice of the intended lawsuit to be filed by the Laskys against Royal Caribbean Cruises Ltd. and its agents and employees for negligence leading to the wrongful death of Mr. David Lasky on March 13, 2011.

Mr. Lasky was an occupant of Suite 1620 on "Navigator of the Seas" at the time of his death. During his occupancy in his suite, he fell striking his head. Mrs. Lasky summoned assistance and improperly trained security personnel, not involved with the hotel hospital or commissary, arrived, as well as medical personnel. The security people who arrived had no knowledge or training as to how to handle an individual of Mr. Lasky's age (72) and, without taking into account the nature and extent of his injuries, mishandled him, causing the injuries which ultimately claimed Mr. Lasky's life, i.e., fracture of the vertebrae between the spinal column and the skull. Mr. Lasky was taken to the hospital where he remained until his death on March 13, 2011.

Additionally, the cruiseline was responsible for the negligent acts of its medical staff, notwithstanding the fallacious claim that the cruiseline makes that they are not apparent agents of the cruiseline. They are, indeed, agents and under the total and absolute control of the cruiseline. Additionally, the medical personnel involved, in addition to the security personnel, were equally untrained in the handling of people with head and neck injuries, which also proximately contributed to Mr. Lasky's demise.

Finally, your cruiseline should immediately place on notice the corporation or individuals who were responsible for hiring the medical personnel who were involved in this tragic event and should provide the names of those companies or individuals to counsel as soon as possible.

We are prepared to discuss settlement, if you wish, but will definitely be filing suit within the one (1) year statute of limitations.
