² Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 6(a)(2), because the actual deadline for filing objections—Saturday, September 11, 2010—fell on a weekend, the deadline was extended to Monday, September 13, 2010. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. 6(a)(2).
