## ORDER

Before the Court is the Recommendation of Magistrate Judge Stephen Hyles. (Doc. 12). The Magistrate Judge recommends granting the Respondent's motion to dismiss (Doc. 7) because the Petitioner did not file his 28 U.S.C. § 2254 petition within the one-year period of limitations and failed to establish entitlement to equitable tolling.

The Petitioner has filed an objection to the Recommendation. (Doc. 13).
