ORDER

After screening the Plaintiff's complaint (Doc. 1) pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915A, United States Magistrate Judge Stephen Hyles ordered the claim against Defendant Geoffrey Glover to proceed but recommends dismissing the Plaintiff's claims for equitable relief and dismissing Defendants Sergeant Casey Bearden and Warden Gregory McLaughlin. (Doc. 5). The Plaintiff has not objected to the Recommendation.¹ The Court has reviewed the Recommendation, and the Court accepts and adopts the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the Magistrate Judge. The Recommendation is **ADOPTED** and made the Order of this Court. Accordingly, the Plaintiff's claims for equitable relief and the claims against Bearden and McLaughlin are **DISMISSED**. Bearden and McLaughlin are **DISMISSED** as Defendants in this action.
