

U. Professor Vincent Lloyd

1733. Professor Vincent Lloyd is currently employed as a professor at Georgia State University.

1) HON1000 – Love: Religious and Philosophical Perspectives – Fall 2009

1734. Professor Lloyd taught HON1000 during Fall 2009.

1735. 15 students enrolled in Professor Lloyd's section of HON1000.

i. The Fragility of Goodness: Luck and Ethics in Greek Tragedy and Philosophy

1736. Professor Lloyd used an excerpt from the work **The Fragility of Goodness** while teaching HON1000 during Fall 2009.

1737. **The Fragility of Goodness** is published by Cambridge.

1738. **The Fragility of Goodness** is 589 pages long.

1739. **The Fragility of Goodness** was first published on 1986.

1740. The revised edition of **The Fragility of Goodness** was first published in 2001.

1741. No application to register **The Fragility of Goodness** was ever filed with the U.S. Copyright Office.

1742. Professor Lloyd prepared a fair use checklist prior to requesting that the library put the excerpt of the work on Georgia State University's ERes system.

1743. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that was placed on Georgia State University's ERes system was 36 pages long, and constituted one chapter and 6.5% of the work.

1744. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that was placed on Georgia State University's ERes system was used for a nonprofit, educational purpose. Namely, the excerpt was used as part of Professor Lloyd's course materials for the purpose of teaching his class, and neither Professor Lloyd, Georgia State University, nor the named defendants profited from the use of the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness**.

1745. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that was placed on Georgia State University's ERes system was not used for commercial purposes.

1746. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that was placed on Georgia State University's ERes system was used by Professor Lloyd for the purpose of teaching the students in his course.

1747. Neither Georgia State University, Professor Lloyd, nor the named Defendants profited from the use of the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that was placed on Georgia State University's ERes system.

1748. Professor Lloyd did not use the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that he placed on Georgia State University's ERes system for the purpose of entertainment.

1749. Professor Lloyd did not publish or publicly distribute the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that he placed on Georgia State University's ERes system.

1750. Professor Lloyd's use of the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that he placed on Georgia State University's ERes system did not exceed his intended educational purpose.

1751. **The Fragility of Goodness** is a published work.

1752. **The Fragility of Goodness** is a factual work of nonfiction.

1753. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that Professor Lloyd used in his course was important to his educational objectives.

1754. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that Professor Lloyd used in his course amounts to 6.5% of the work, and as such, was a small portion of **The Fragility of Goodness**.

1755. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that Professor Lloyd used in his course was not central to the work.

1756. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** that Professor Lloyd used in his course was narrowly tailored for Professor Lloyd's educational purpose.

1757. Professor Lloyd's use of the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** did not have a significant effect on the market or potential market for the copyrighted work because the ERes excerpt was restricted to his class.

1758. Professor Lloyd's use of the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** stimulated the market for the original work.

1759. The publisher of **The Fragility of Goodness** does not market any similar product.

1760. A small number of copies of the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** were distributed—specifically, the ERes records indicate that the work was accessed 36 times.

1761. Access to the excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** was limited to the students in the class by a password protected website.

1762. The excerpt of **The Fragility of Goodness** was removed from the ERes system after the semester ended.
