AFFIDAVIT OF R.L. "BUTCH" CONWAY

Personally appears before me, the undersigned officer duly authorized to administer oath in and for the State of Georgia, Sheriff. R. L. "Butch" Conway, who, after being duly sworn, deposes and states his oath as follows:

1.

My name is Sheriff R. L. "Butch" Conway. I am *sui juris* and competent to testify in this matter and under no civil or legal disability. I give this Affidavit as evidence in the above-styled action and for any lawful purpose. I make this Affidavit based on my personal knowledge of its contents.

2.

I serve as Sheriff of Gwinnett County, a position I have held since being elected Sheriff in 1996. In my role as Sheriff, I am responsible for maintaining the Gwinnett County Jail and managing the 287(g) program in conjunction with U. S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement.

Based upon this position, I am familiar with the costs of incarcerating illegal aliens.

3.

The 287(g) program is a federal program that allows Gwinnett County Sheriff's deputies under the supervision of U. S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to place a detainer on illegal aliens arrested and housed in the Gwinnett County Jail.

4.

My office tracks the number of illegal aliens detained each day. The average daily number of illegal aliens detained in our detention facilities since June 10, 2010 through June 9, 2011 is 507.4, with a high of 633 on June 14, 2010, and a low of 405 on May 13, 2011. When the number of illegal aliens detained each day during that year-long period is summed, the total sum of illegal alien detention days is 185,200.
