## <u>ORDER</u>

Plaintiff James Anthony, represented by counsel, brought this civil rights and personal injury case against the Bulloch County Board of Commissioners; Lynn M. Anderson, in his official capacity as Sherriff of Bulloch County; and several employees of the Bulloch County Sherriff's Department. Doc. 1.
