

**DECLARATION OF MICHAEL H. PAGE IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO LIMIT
DISCOVERY AND FOR SCHEDULING ORDER**

I, Michael H. Page, declare as follows:

1. I am a partner in the firm of Durie Tangri Page Lemley Roberts & Kent LLP, counsel of record for Defendant Google Inc. in the above-captioned matter. Unless otherwise indicated, the matters set forth herein are of my own personal knowledge, and if called I can and will testify competently thereto.
2. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is a true and correct copy of Google's December 4, 2007 Case Management Statement, attaching Plaintiffs' draft discovery to Google.
3. Attached hereto as Exhibit B is a true and correct copy of my May 11, 2009 letter to Plaintiff's counsel Robert Foote.
4. Attached hereto as Exhibit C is a true and correct copy of a May 15, 2009 letter to me from Mr. Foote.
5. In previous discussions, Plaintiffs' counsel have stated to me that they will continue to seek discovery into all of the millions of domains to which Google delivers advertisements, notwithstanding denial of class certification.
6. In anticipation of mediation earlier this month, Google in February produced to all parties a tabulation of all advertising activity, and all income from those advertisements, on each of the approximately 123 domains that Plaintiffs assert infringe their rights. The total gross income for all advertisements on all 123 domains was \$490.81.
