

Huon filed the suit in U.S. District Court in Chicago and sent copies of his complaint to news outlets in the Metro East.

Huon was acquitted May 5, 2010, after a woman claimed she met him in St. Louis as part of a job interview. She said she was a promotional model and that Huon told her he wanted to interview her.

They ended up drinking in several bars. After what a defense attorney called "a thorough night of bar-hopping," the woman claimed Huon was driving her north on Interstate 55 while groping her, putting his finger inside her and forcing her into an oral sex act.

Defense attorneys claimed the so-called "job interview" became social and that the alleged victim demanded money after the alleged sex acts. They claimed she "cried rape" in revenge for not receiving any money.

The woman jumped out of the car near New Douglas. She testified that she was hysterical. She knocked on doors of nearby residents. They testified she appeared hysterical.

In his suit, Huon recounts much of the trial, as well as subsequent charges of harassment of a witness and cyber-stalking.

Those charges were dropped after the not guilty verdict in the sex case.

Among allegations in the suit are that the Madison County Sheriff's Department published falsehoods in a news release about the case; that they performed an illegal wiretap; that
