DEFENDANTS' UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR LEAVE
TO FILE BRIEF IN EXCESS OF FIFTEEN PAGES

Defendants Breaking Media, LLC (erroneously sued as AboveTheLaw.com,
BreakingMedia.com, and Breaking Media), David Lat, Elie Mystal, John Lerner, and David
Minkin (the "ATL Defendants") respectfully request that the Court grant them leave to file their
memorandum in support of their motion to dismiss ("Memorandum"), which exceeds the 15-
page limit established by Local Rule 7.1.

1. The ATL Defendants have endeavored to use the minimum number of pages
necessary to present their various arguments concerning Plaintiff's numerous factual and legal
contentions.
