Section §§ 411 of The Copyright Act allows, 20 for the owner of the works to bring forth an infringement lawsuit, only if the owner 21 has a registered copyright with the Copyright Office. Plaintiff, also claims that the above Defendants violated The Digital Millennium Copyright Act of 1998, §§ Title 17, U.S.C, and The Online Copyright Infringement Liability Limitation Act, Title II, Sec. §§ 512 3 (c), Safe Harbor.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Plaintiff claims that she submitted her Poetry Manuscript, "Glimpses of Life", for self-publishing through the website, www.LuLu.com, in 2006(if she is not mistaken). She claims that this site explained that Authors books can be uploaded, but Authors would have to self-market their own books. The site also claimed that "they do not market Authors books". Plaintiff further claims that she has recently discovered that her book has in fact been "marketed", "distributed", and "sold", by Lulu.com, thus contradicting their statements of non-marketing for Authors.

Plaintiff, alleges, that her book was marketed, distributed and sold without her expressed knowledge, consent or permission. She claims that she had not signed a Statutory or Compulsory Licensing agreement, nor did she transfer her copyright ownership or sign a contractual agreement. She alleges that she was not notified, via email, postal mail, or by telephone, of their desire to market, distribute or sell her book to various, online or offline, book sellers or publishers. She also, claims that the number of units sold has not been cached under her account, therefore, she is unaware of the actual numbers of units sold, and that Lulu, is a dishonest and unethical, self-publishing company.

She further alleges that her book was "bought", by various online book sellers, such as:

5	She claims that she discovered that her book was being sold with these Book sellers,
6	while conducting online research on 03/17/2012. She also has submitted printed copies
7	of her book being sold on these websites.

10	JURISDICTIONAL STATEMENT

13	Plaintiff claims 28 U.S.C, 1291, and that the Federal District Court, Northern
14	District of Illinois, has Federal Question and Subject Matter Jurisdiction because she
15	has alleged a violation of the Constitution or law of the United States.

18	Prayer for Relief/Damages
19	
20	Wherefore, Plaintiff claims \$150,000 per works, which amounts to \$750,000, in
21	statutory damages. However, she may need to amend/increase the amount of the judgment
22	demand because; she may discover more booksellers/publishers that may be currently
23	selling her book.


