



for “their failure to comply with this Court’s order” compelling responses to post-judgment discovery. (*See* Doc. 68.)

The Court **DENIES** Plaintiff’s motion for two reasons. First, the Court finds that the procedure used by Plaintiff is impractical and ultimately will be ineffective. Finding a defunct corporation to be in contempt, and ordering it to pay fines, for the failure to respond to discovery following a default judgment is not a practical solution to Plaintiff’s continued inability to compile the requested information. Second, the Court has serious concerns that the relief requested by Plaintiff would run afoul of the bankruptcy Order and Stay currently in effect regarding individual Defendant Sonya Cummings. The Court notes that said individual Defendant has indicated in court filings that she is doing business as C & D Complete Business Solutions, the corporate Defendant in this matter.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Plaintiff’s Motion for Order to Show Cause (Doc. 68) is **DENIED** for the reasons set forth above.
