**ORDER AND REASONS**

Before the Court is a motion *in limine* to exclude the opinions of Plaintiff Kendrick Thomas's general causation expert, Dr. Jerald Cook ("Cook"), filed by Defendants, BP Exploration & Production, BP America Production Company, and BP p.l.c.<sup>1</sup> Also before the Court is the Defendants' motion for summary judgment.<sup>2</sup> Plaintiff has filed oppositions to both motions,<sup>3</sup> and Defendants have filed replies.<sup>4</sup> Plaintiff separately filed a spoliation motion,<sup>5</sup> which Defendants oppose.<sup>6</sup>

Defendant's motion *in limine* and motion for summary judgment are nearly identical to the ones filed by Defendants, and granted by this Court, in other B3 cases.<sup>7</sup> Likewise, Plaintiff's spoliation motion argues Defendants had a duty to create evidence,<sup>8</sup> the same argument made by other B3 Plaintiffs, and denied by this Court, in other B3

cases.<sup>9</sup>

Accordingly, for the reasons stated in the Orders & Reasons issued in the cited B3 cases;

**IT IS ORDERED** that the motion *in limine* is **GRANTED**.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the spoliation motion is **DENIED**.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the motion for summary judgment is **GRANTED**. A separate judgment will be entered in favor of Defendants BP Exploration & Production, BP America Production Company, BP p.l.c., Halliburton Energy Services, Inc., Transocean Holdings LLC, Transocean Deepwater, Inc., and Transocean Offshore Deepwater Drilling, Inc., and against Plaintiff on all claims.
