## RULING ON MOTION TO ASSIGN CASE FOR TRIAL

Plaintiff stated in his motion that he consents to proceed before a U.S. Magistrate Judge pursuant to 28 U.S.C.  $\S$  636(c). However, unless the defendant also consents,  $\S$  636(c) does not authorize a magistrate judge to conduct a jury trial.
