RULING AND ORDER

Plaintiff Robert Pooler ("Plaintiff") is an inmate at the Louisiana State Penitentiary

who has filed a Motion for Preliminary Injunction wherein he admits that he has failed

to exhaust his administrative remedies. (Doc. 3 at pp. 2—3). That is a problem, given that a

prisoner who files suit under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 "must exhaust his administrative remedies

'irrespective of the forms of relief sought and offered through administrative avenues."

Ferrington v. Louisiana Dep't of Corr., 315 F.3d 529, 531 (5th Cir. 2002) (quoting Booth v.

Churner, 532 U.S. 731, 741 n.6 (2001)).

The Court therefore finds that Plaintiff has failed to show a substantial likelihood of

success on the merits. See Planned Parenthood Ass'n of Hidalgo Cty. Texas, Inc. v. Suehs,

692 F.3d 343, 348 (5th Cir. 2012).

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that Plaintiff's Motion for Preliminary Injunction (Doc. 3) is

DENIED.
