
**IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED** that the Commissioner's decision is REVERSED and REMANDED to the Commissioner pursuant to the fourth sentence of 42 U.S.C. § 405(g).<sup>1</sup> More particularly, the Commissioner is instructed to give either great weight or controlling weight to the opinions of Dr. Korab, to determine whether Ms. Brown's impairments satisfy any listings other than Listing 4.02, to determine whether the combination of Ms. Brown's impairments meet

or equal the severity of a listed impairment, and to reevaluate Ms. Brown's residual functional capacity.
