Dear Counsel:

I have reviewed the memoranda submitted in connection with defendant's opposition to plaintiffs' motion to amend the first amended complaint and defendant's supplemental motion to dismiss or for summary judgment.

In light of plaintiffs' *pro se* status when they filed the case, I believe that they should be given permission to amend the first amended complaint to assert matters learned during discovery. Therefore, plaintiffs' motion will be granted. Defendant's motion to dismiss or for summary judgment is denied.
